More than you can handle

Intro: (marshmallow test)

James 4:7

We are called to stand firm against the devil

(Eph 6:10-20)

You can be strong and armored up to fight the devils schemes but he is not our only enemy and standing firm is not our only strategy...

Problem:

Prov 6:20-28

(1 cor 8:1-13)

We are not are not as smart as we might think if our liberty causes our brother to sin

(1 cor 9:19-27)

We are not as free as we might think if our liberty causes our mission to languish

In 1 Cor 10 Paul moves on to point out that we are not as strong as we might think if our liberty causes us to sin

Main Idea:

Its more than they could handle Its more than we can handle Run

Implication:

This is not about hardship or persecution or even the devil - there is no hardship or calamity you cannot handle IN Christ

This is about temptation to sin - you cannot handle sin IN Christ that's the point...

This does not say God will not give you more than you can endure - He will not give you more than you can escape...

When it comes to temptation God WILL let you have more than you can handle - but that's the point your were not meant to handle temptation you were meant to run from it...

Application:

Be careful with your liberty - if your liberty causes you to be tempted towards idolatry, sexual immorality, doubt and discontent...run for your life

you were not meant to stand in temptation and resist it - you are not strong enough - you were not meant to be - this is the lesson repeated over and over - you don't merely need Him after you succumb to sin - you need Him when you are planning to (Lord I need you)

More than you can handle

Text:

Its more than they could handle

1Corinthians 10:1 ¶ For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea,

1Corinthians 10:2 and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea,

1Corinthians 10:3 and all ate the same spiritual food,

1Corinthians 10:4 and **all drank** the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ

1Corinthians 10:5 Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.

Deuteronomy 8 (be careful not to forget your dependence when things are good...but how could they forget? Look what they had - if temptation more than they could handle)

num 14:26-35; 20:7-13 (how could Israel forget? How could Moses? If temp. More than he could handle -....)
2 sam 12:7-10 (how could David forget he was the man after Gods own heart? If temp. More than he could handle...)
1 kings 11:1-8 (how could Solomon forget - he was the wisest man on earth - If temp. More than he could handle...)

Its more than we can handle

1Corinthians 10:6 ¶ Now these things took place as examples (typos = types) for us, that we might not desire evil as they did.

1Corinthians 10:7 **Do not be idolaters** as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play."

1Corinthians 10:8 We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day.

1Corinthians 10:9 We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents,

1Corinthians 10:10 **nor grumble**, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer.

1Corinthians 10:11 Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.

matt 26:30-46 (Peter had to learn the hard way that the spirit is willing but the flesh is weak)

rom 7:7-8:1 (so did Paul - Paul knew he could not simply resist temptation...but what is the answer?)

rom 5:18-6:2 (gen 3:1-7 (no one can resist temptation - we cannot resist temptation - garden everything - stood

there and watched his wife eve and then she gave it to him -gen 3:1-7)

not about losing salvation per se but about losing the Christian experience...

should we give up then and resign ourselves to constant failure? Is this the victorious Christian life we are called to live?)

Heb 12:1-4 (should we just resist more-pluck out our eyes cut off our hands?)

(gal 3:1-13 (is this a call for laws of purity etc?)

col 2:20-23 (is this a call for more effort like the Colossians?)

the author of Hebrews is not calling for us to resist to the point of blood but to call our attention to the one who has already)

heb 3:1-4:16 (we have been given a record of failure to get us to stop looking to ourselves for the answer - to get us to go to the throne of grace in our time of need (Luke 3:21-4:13 (Jesus stood firm against the devil and temptation...)

...but that's the point we don't know we need Him until after we fall...which is why we fall over and over again)

run

1Corinthians 10:12 Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.

1Corinthians 10:13 No temptation has overtaken you that is not **common to man**. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability (to escape), but with the temptation **he will also provide the way of escape**, that you may be able to endure it. 1Corinthians 10:14 ¶ Therefore, my beloved, **flee from idolatry**

gen 39:1-13 (before I exhort you to run away ask yourself why he did)

James 1:12-15 (he knew he was being tempted not by God but by his own desire --he fled because not because he was strong but because he knew he wasn't - we think we are too strong too confident)

(matt 5:21-22, 27-28 (he knew what the law is meant to teach us about our nature about our sin...)

Sin aims always at the utmost; every time it rises up to tempt or entice, might it have its own course, it would go out to the utmost sin in that kind. Every unclean thought or glance would be adultery if it could; every covetous desire would be oppression, every thought of unbelief would be atheism, might it grow to its head. (Owen - overcoming sin and temptation)

2 cor 1:8-9 (imp)

1 Tim 1:15 this was not a cute hyperbole- Paul knew he wasn't strong - but we don't - otherwise we wouldn't be so casual about our liberty - app)
