# SHEPHERD'S CORNER



So much has been written about the birth of Jesus in secular and scriptural accounts that little, if anything, remains hidden. However, the thing that continues to impress me is the part God played in the event. In Matthew's account (Matt. 1:18-2:23) God enters the process on several instances.

Initially, as Brian mentioned last Sunday, God had planned at least 400 years in advance, for the delivery of his son to this earth (Malachi 4). God knew the only way to provide access to heaven for humankind was through a blood sacrifice, and that had to come from deity. I am not presupposing to know the mind of God, but judging from the events and purpose of Jesus' birth God decided that his son would be sent to save the world. That decision is difficult for me to understand on several levels; first, how could God love the world that was rejecting him? Why not simply destroy it like he did in the flood of Noah's day? Secondly, sending his son to die is a decision I cannot understand as a parent and a human. That is why I cannot understand the decision, I am not a deity.

Next, God used the Holy Spirit to announce her pregnancy to Mary, and He used an angel to make the same explanation to Joseph. As to the wise men coming from the East, how did they learn of Jesus' birth? Who placed the star in the heavens to direct them if not God? Who appeared to the wise men in a dream to return home by a different route if not God? God intervenes again by sending an angel to direct Joseph in a dream to flee into Egypt with his family and stays there until told by an angel to go to the land of Israel. When he fears for his safety there, God directs him to Galilee.

The rest of the story is, as they say, history. Jesus leaves Nazareth in Galilee, is baptized by John in the Jordan river, affirmed by God in the appearance of a dove, tempted by Satan for forty days then enters his ministry by declaring the message, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand (Matt. 4:17)." This synopsis covers the first thirty years of Jesus' life (Lk. 3:23). What a blessing this baby was!


