Mark 16:1

“Who will roll away the stone for us from
the entrance to the tomb?”

Mark 16:3

But as they arrived, they looked up and saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled aside.

Mark 16:4

When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man clothed in a white robe sitting on the right side.

Mark 16:5

The women were shocked, but the angel
said,
“Don’t be alarmed. You are looking for

John 20:1

She ran and found Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved.

She said, “They have taken the Lord’s body out of the tomb, and we don’t know where they have put him!”
