Pharaoh sent for Moses and Aaron during the night.

Exodus 12:31 (NLT)



"Get out!" he ordered. "Leave my people - and take the rest of the Israelites with you! Go and worship the LORD as you have requested.

Take your flocks and herds, as you said, and be gone. Go, but bless me as you leave."





All the Egyptians urged the people of Israel to get out of the land as quickly as possible.

When word reached the king of Egypt that the Israelites had fled, Pharaoh and his officials changed their minds.

Exodus 14:5 (NLT)



"What have we done, letting all those Israelites slaves get away?" they asked.

Exodus 14:5 (NLT)



So Pharaoh harnessed his chariot and called up his troops. He took with him 600 of Egypt's best chariots, along with the rest of the chariots of Egypt, each with its commander.



Exodus 14:6-7 (NLT)

The Egyptians chased after them with all the forces in Pharaoh's army - all his horses and chariots, his charioteers, and his troops.

Exodus 14:9 (NLT)



The Egyptians caught up with the people of Israel as they were camped beside the shore near Pi-hahiroth, across from Baal-zephon.

As Pharaoh approached, the people of Israel looked up and panicked when they saw the Egyptians overtaking them.





They cried out to the LORD, and they said to Moses, "Why did you bring us out here to die in the wilderness? Weren't there enough graves for us in Egypt?





What have you done to us? Why did you make us leave Egypt? Didn't we tell you this would happen while we were still in Egypt?

Exodus 14:11-12 (NLT)



We said, 'Leave us alone! Let us be slaves to the Egyptians. It's better to be a slave in Egypt than a corpse in the wilderness!'"

But Moses told the people,

"Don't be afraid. Just stand still and watch the LORD rescue you today. The Egyptians you see today will never be seen again.

Exodus 14:13 (NLT)



The LORD himself will fight for you. Just stay calm."

Exodus 14:14 (NLT)



Then the LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the people to get moving!



Exodus 14:15 (NLT)

Pick up your staff and raise your hand over the sea. Divide the water so the Israelites can walk through the middle of the sea on dry ground.



Exodus 14:16 (NLT)

And I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians, and they will charge in after the Israelites.





My great glory will be displayed through Pharaoh and his troops, his chariots, and his charioteers.





When my glory is displayed through them, all Egypt will see my glory and know that I am the LORD!"

Exodus 14:18 (NLT)



Then Moses raised his hand over the sea, and the LORD opened up a path through the water with strong east wind. The wind blew all that night, turning the seabed into dry land.



Exodus 14:21 (NLT)

So the people of Israel walked through the middle of the sea on dry ground, with walls of water on each side!



Exodus 14:22 (NLT)

When all the Israelites had reached the other side, the LORD said to Moses, "Raise your hand over the sea again.





Then the waters will rush back and cover the Egyptians and their chariots and charioteers."





So as the sun began to rise, Moses raised his hand over the sea, and the water rushed back into its usual place.





The Egyptians tried to escape, but the LORD swept them into the sea.

Exodus 14:27 (NLT)



But the people of Israel had walked through the middle of the sea on dry ground, as the water stood up like a wall on both sides.

Exodus 14:29 (NLT)



When the people of Israel saw the mighty power that the LORD had unleashed against the Egyptians -





they were filled with awe before him. They put their faith in the LORD and in his servant Moses.
