- Christian mother died when he was 7 years old
- > Learned to be a sailor from his father
- Deserted the Royal Navy & was publicly flogged
- > Slave trader & almost died
- > Became a minister and author
- > 1772 wrote Amazing Grace (age 47)
- > Fought & helped abolish slave trade

And since we have been made right in God's sight by the blood of Christ, he will certainly save us from God's condemnation.

For since <u>our friendship with God was restored</u> by the death of his Son while we were still his enemies,

we will certainly <u>be saved</u> through the life of his Son.

So now we can <u>rejoice</u> in our <u>wonderful new</u> <u>relationship</u> with God because our Lord Jesus Christ has made us <u>friends of God.</u>
