


Genesis 16:1 (NLT)

So Sarai said to Abram, "The LORD has prevented me from having children. Go and sleep with my servant. Perhaps I can have children through her."

And Abram agreed with Sarai's proposal.

Genesis 16:2 (NLT)

So Sarai, Abram's wife, took Hagar the Egyptian servant and gave her to Abram as a wife.

Genesis 16:3 (NLT)

So Abram had relations with Hagar, and she became pregnant. But when Hagar knew she was pregnant, she began to treat her mistress, Sarai, with contempt.

Genesis 16:4 (NLT)

Then Sarai said to Abram, "This is all your fault!

I put my servant into your arms, but now that she's pregnant she treats me with contempt. The LORD will show who's wrong - you or me!"

Genesis 16:5 (NLT)

Abram replied, "Look, she is your servant, so deal with her as you see fit." Then Sarai treated Hagar so harshly that she finally ran away.

Genesis 16:6 (NLT)

The angel of the LORD found Hagar beside a spring of water in the wilderness, along the road to Shur.

Genesis 16:7 (NLT)

The angel said to her, "Hagar, Sarai's servant, where have you come from, and where are you going?"

"I'm running away from my mistress, Sarai," she replied.

Genesis 16:8 (NLT)

The angel of the LORD said to her, "Return to your mistress, and submit to her authority."

Genesis 16:9 (NLT)

Then he added, "I will give you more descendants than you can count."

Genesis 16:10 (NLT)

And the angel also said, "You are now pregnant and will give birth to a son. You are to name him Ishmael (which means 'God hears'), for the LORD has heard your cry of distress.

Genesis 16:11 (NLT)

Thereafter, Hagar used another name to refer to the LORD, who had spoken to her. She said,

"You are the God who sees me."

Genesis 16:13 (NLT)

She also said, "Have I truly seen the One who sees me?"

So that well was named Beer-Lahai-Roi (which means "well of the Living One who sees me.")

O LORD, you have examined my heart and know everything about me.

Psalm 139:1 (NLT)

You see me when I travel and when I rest at home.
You know everything I do.

Psalm 139:3 (NLT)

You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head.

Psalm 139:5 (NLT)

Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand!

Psalm 139:6 (NLT)

I can never escape from your Spirit!

I can never get away from your presence!

Psalm 139:7 (NLT)

If I go up to heaven, you are there; If I go down to the grave, you are there.

Psalm 139:8 (NLT)

If I ride the wings of the morning, if I dwell by the farthest oceans, even there your hand will guide me, and your strength will support me.

Psalm 139:9-10 (NLT)

I could ask the darkness to hide me and the light around me to become night - but even in darkness I cannot hide from you.

Psalm 139:11-12 (NLT)

Can anything ever separate us from Christ's love?

Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death?

Romans 8:35 (NLT)

No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us.

Romans 8:37 (NLT)

And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love.

Romans 8:38 (NLT)

Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears of today nor our worries about tomorrow - not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love.

No power in the sky above or in the earth below - indeed, nothing in all creation will ever -
