## **Week 30 – Proper Tongues**

# 1) Understanding And Intelligibility Must Be The Result Of Spiritual Gifts

### 2) There Must Be Control Of The Gift

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 14

#### **Prophecy and Tongues**

**14** Pursue love, and desire spiritual *gifts*, but especially that you may prophesy. <sup>2</sup> For he who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God, for no one understands *him*; however, in the spirit he speaks mysteries. <sup>3</sup> But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men. <sup>4</sup> He who speaks in a tongue edifies himself, but he who prophesies edifies the church. <sup>5</sup> I wish you all spoke with tongues, but even more that you prophesied; 

if or he who prophesies *is* greater than he who speaks with tongues, unless indeed he interprets, that the church may receive edification.

#### **Tongues Must Be Interpreted**

<sup>6</sup> But now, brethren, if I come to you speaking with tongues, what shall I profit you unless I speak to you either by revelation, by knowledge, by prophesying, or by teaching? <sup>7</sup> Even things without life, whether flute or harp, when they make a sound, unless they make a distinction in the sounds, how will it be known what is piped or played? <sup>8</sup> For if the trumpet makes an uncertain sound, who will prepare for battle? <sup>9</sup> So likewise you, unless you utter by the tongue words easy to understand, how will it be known what is spoken? For you will be speaking into the air. <sup>10</sup> There are, it may be, so many kinds of languages in the world, and none of them *is* without wsignificance. <sup>11</sup> Therefore, if I do not know the meaning of the language, I shall be a wforeigner to him who speaks, and he who speaks *will be* a foreigner to me. <sup>12</sup> Even so you, since you are wzealous for spiritual *gifts, let it be* for the wedification of the church *that* you seek to excel.

<sup>13</sup> Therefore let him who speaks in a tongue pray that he may interpret. <sup>14</sup> For if I pray in a tongue, my spirit prays, but my understanding is unfruitful. <sup>15</sup> What is *the conclusion* then? I will pray with the spirit, and I will also pray with the understanding. I will sing with the spirit, and I will also sing with the understanding. <sup>16</sup> Otherwise, if you bless with the spirit, how will he who occupies the place of the uninformed say "Amen" at your giving of thanks, since he does not understand what you say? <sup>17</sup> For you indeed give thanks well, but the other is not edified.

<sup>18</sup> I thank my God I speak with tongues more than you all; <sup>19</sup> yet in the church I would rather speak five words with my understanding, that I may teach others also, than ten thousand words in a tongue.

#### **Tongues a Sign to Unbelievers**

<sup>20</sup> Brethren, do not be children in understanding; however, in malice be babes, but in understanding be mature.

<sup>21</sup> In the law it is written:

"With men of other tongues and other lips I will speak to this people; And yet, for all that, they will not hear Me,"

says the Lord.

<sup>22</sup> Therefore tongues are for a sign, not to those who believe but to unbelievers; but prophesying is not for unbelievers but for those who believe. <sup>23</sup> Therefore if the whole church comes together in one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in *those who are* uninformed or unbelievers, will they not say that you are "out of your mind? <sup>24</sup> But if all prophesy, and an unbeliever or an uninformed person comes in, he is convinced by all, he is convicted by all. <sup>25</sup> And thus the secrets of his heart are revealed; and so, falling down on *his* face, he will worship God and report that God is truly among you.

#### **Order in Church Meetings**

<sup>26</sup> How is it then, brethren? Whenever you come together, each of you has a psalm, has a teaching, has a tongue, has a revelation, has an interpretation. Let all things be done for medification. <sup>27</sup> If anyone speaks in a tongue, *let there be* two or at the most three, *each* in turn, and let one interpret. <sup>28</sup> But if there is no interpreter, let him keep silent in church, and let him speak to himself and to God. <sup>29</sup> Let two or three prophets speak, and let the others judge. <sup>30</sup> But if *anything* is revealed to another who sits by, let the first keep silent. <sup>31</sup> For you can all prophesy one by one, that all may learn and all may be encouraged. <sup>32</sup> And the spirits of the prophets are subject to the prophets. <sup>33</sup> For God is not *the author* of monfusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints.

<sup>34</sup> Let <sup>a</sup>your women keep silent in the churches, for they are not permitted to speak; but *they are* to be submissive, as the law also says. <sup>35</sup> And if they want to learn something, let them ask their own husbands at home; for it is shameful for women to speak in church.

<sup>36</sup> Or did the word of God come *originally* from you? Or *was it* you only that it reached? <sup>37</sup> If anyone thinks himself to be a prophet or spiritual, let him acknowledge that the things which I write to you are the commandments of the Lord. <sup>38</sup> But <sup>™</sup> if anyone is ignorant, let him be ignorant.

<sup>39</sup> Therefore, brethren, desire earnestly to prophesy, and do not forbid to speak with tongues. <sup>40</sup> Let all things be done decently and in order.
