



**Days of Noah
Transhumanism, a Man who Becomes an It. Really?
Luke 17:26-30**

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Last time we looked at the Days of Lot and skimmed over the reference to the Days of Noah. We already know that the section of scripture we are looking at is Jesus describing what some of the conditions of the world will be when He appears in the clouds, as promised, and removes His church, as promised, before the beginning of the Day of the Lord also known as the Tribulation.

We also know that what Jesus was talking about was business as usual in unusual times.



Luke 17:26–30

“And just as it happened in the days of Noah, so will it also be in the days of the Son of Man: people were eating, they were drinking, they were marrying, and they were being given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered the ark, and the flood came and destroyed them all. It was the same as happened in the days of Lot: they were eating, they were drinking, they were buying, they were selling, they were planting, and they were building; but on the day that Lot left Sodom, it rained fire and brimstone from heaven and destroyed them all. It will be just the same on the day that the Son of Man is revealed.” (NASB 2020)

To understand the Days of Noah, let's take a look at Genesis 6 which lays them out to us. I am going to read from the Septuagint which has a different chapter and verse structure than our NASB we use.

Genesis 6:1–8

“And Noah lived five hundred years, and Noah fathered three sons: Shem, Ham, and Japheth. And it happened when humans began to become numerous upon the earth, and they had daughters, the angels of God, having seen the daughters of humans, that they were beautiful, took for themselves women from all whom they picked out. The Lord God said, “My breath will certainly not reside in these humans for very long because they are flesh, but their days will be one hundred and twenty years.” Now giants were upon the earth in those days, and after that, whenever the sons of God entered into the daughters of humans, they fathered children for themselves; those were the giants who were from long ago, the people of renown. **Now the Lord God saw that the wicked actions of humans multiplied upon the earth, and everyone was focused in his heart on evil things all their days.** And God reflected that he made humankind upon the earth and considered. And God said, “I will discard humanity, whom I made, from the face of the earth, from human to animal, and from creeping things to winged birds of the heavens, because I am angry that I made them.” But Noah found grace before the Lord God.” (Brannan, et al. 2020)

At the heart of the problem, fallen angels raping and taking whoever they wanted and creating a hybrid population of non-humans called giants here in the text. The intent was to corrupt the planet and eliminate the possibility of there being a man born who will fulfill Genesis 3:15.

What we see here coming from that is an outlandish prophecy. God says He will destroy the planet which has billions living on it. He will do it in 120 years. He will do it in a manner that will require a rather large barge be constructed. In fact, He is going to make it do something that has never before occurred on the planet...rain.

So, for 120 years, work takes place with Noah building something no one had ever seen before in the middle of dry ground, a vessel, actually a large barge, being hand constructed.

What was it like at that time since Jesus says it will be replicated before the rapture?

The condition is as follows “Now the Lord God saw that the wicked actions of humans multiplied upon the earth, and everyone was focused in his heart on evil things all their days.” We earlier learned this was induced by the corrupting of man and it was a group of fallen divine beings, watchers, who were behind this. So, if fallen angels are taking and sexually assaulting whoever they want, or worse, the women were complicit and very okay with this, how vile did man become to get this far down?

And now we discover, it will happen again.

Prior to the flood, conditions seem to include the following. Long life spans – 900 years and this means large families. Totally different conditions than today to include water vapor canopy, atmospheric pressure



at least twice that of today – 14.7 psi today, 29.4 psi then? A totally different biosphere and most likely one land mass. There was most likely a high population, somewhere between 3 billion to potentially over 100 billion (there is evidence of large cities in the Andes and in other places as well).

High technology thanks to the sons of Cain as well as the fallen watchers corrupting the planet (Enoch 8). High levels of wickedness with violence and evil everywhere.

Externally, everywhere that God looked there was sin. Internally, all that man did was create new ways of sinning, in fact that is all they thought about. Now we are beginning to see why the comparison to the Days of Noah that Jesus uses. These two things are no different than what we have seen taking place globally today.

Romans 1:28–32

“Since they thought it foolish to acknowledge God, he abandoned them to their foolish thinking and let them do things that should never be done. Their lives became full of every kind of wickedness, sin, greed, hate, envy, murder, quarreling, deception, malicious behavior, and gossip. They are backstabbers, haters of God, insolent, proud, and boastful. **They invent new ways of sinning**, and they disobey their parents. They refuse to understand, break their promises, are heartless, and have no mercy. **They know God’s justice requires that those who do these things deserve to die, yet they do them anyway. Worse yet, they encourage others to do them, too.**” (NLT)

And where does the encouraging take place? Media. Just take a look and see what we do with in our spare time in this nation. “The inescapable reality is that we are a nation addicted to media input. Statistics vary, but we know that the typical adult allocates more than fifty hours per week to media absorption. In fact, the only activity that takes more of our time is sleeping. Based on criteria developed by the American Psychiatric Association, our devotion to media content is literally an addiction—perhaps the most widespread and insidious addiction in our society today. (Barna 2011, 11)

Okay, so we are addicted to media and what does media do? It glorifies exactly what Satan wants to promote, and we see that in the culture. Per Francis Schaeffer in his book, *Escape from Reason*.

The mass of people have received the new way of thinking through the mass media without analyzing it. It is worse for them because they have been smashed in the face by it, because the cinema, television, the books they read, the press, magazines have been infiltrated by the new thought-forms in an unanalyzed way...the reason why Christians are not understanding their own children is because the children are being educated into the other way of thinking. It is not merely that they think different things. They think differently. Their thinking has changed in such a way that when you say Christianity is true, the sentence does not mean to them what it means to you. (Schaeffer 1982, 235)

Modern techniques that are intentional in influencing perception and behavior include targeted messaging, AI-generated deepfakes, and attention-driven content. Mental health is profoundly affected by media exposure. (Luskin 2026)

Throw in the latest widely available AI tools and you can now produce whatever fantasies you desire.

The Days of Noah are to be characterized by what was evident at the time of Noah, rampant immorality, sin and wickedness. Just stop and consider that currently, over 2 billion people on this planet identify as Muslim. Islam is non-Christian religion that plays with truth.

Islam teaches the “doctrine of taqiyya (dissimulation or concealment) allows deception in order to save face or honour or the reputation of Islam especially in times of religious persecution. Hamid Enayat, a Muslim historian who was a fellow of St Antony’s College, Oxford, stated, ‘[Taqiyya has] in practice



become the norm of public behavior among all Muslims—both Sunni and Shi’a—whenever there is a conflict between faith and expediency.’ This means that although ‘truth’ is considered very important to Islam and its religion, as revealed in the Quran, non-Muslims often face ‘false or exaggerated statements introduced in order to make Islam appear in a better light’. ‘Islamization of knowledge’ is ‘part and parcel’ of Muslim evangelization, and the Quran seems to justify this: ‘And make not your own hands contribute to (Your) destruction but do good’ (Sura 2:195). (McNaughton 2019, 72)

What that means is that based on just following their religion, over 24% of the global population not only lies, but believes it is necessary to make their religion look better than any other religion. Thus, the outlandish statements we have been seeing lately to include the increase in lying and deception we have seen in this nation. AI is an enabler of this and of course, deception per Jesus (Matthew 24:4,12) will only get worse before He returns in the Second Coming.

This throwing away of morality, days of Noah stuff, is showing up in the work of George Barna as well as he describes conditions in some groups in our nation.

“Together, a majority of those groups approve of lying for personal benefit, **sex on demand, abortion, idolatry, and various lifestyle vices**. Their will is not monolithic—there are other population segments larger in size, or which possess considerable counter-balancing influence. However, the trajectory of the three segments (Gen Z, Atheistic-Agnostic, Asian) indicates they have considerable favor and impact within today’s society. Those who ignore the cultural influence they wield do so at their own peril.” Barna summed up his observations by stating that unless the Christian Church—both as an accumulation of individual believers as well as a coalition of religious institutions—becomes more engaged in the intentional determination of the moral and spiritual framework of American society, traditional biblical morality will be a historical footnote within a couple of decades. “Our national moral code is increasingly being shaped by cultural rather than spiritual forces,” he said. “If Christians in America want a nation based on biblical morality, they must be clearer and more assertive in teaching, evaluating, and modeling of the biblical worldview and its resultant lifestyle choices. As matters stand now, the biblical worldview is poised to lose what little ground it currently occupies in America, including an increased loss of influence related to our national morality.” (Barna, 2025 American Worldview Inventory - Report #10 Americans' Redefinition of Sinful Behavior Fuels Social Turbulence 2025)

For 125 years, Noah warned about impending judgment that was coming. And for 125 years, he was ignored. There may have been some interest initially, but by the time all was over, it was only eight people, Noah’s family.

A global population in the billions, and yet only 8 people were saved from the judgment. It was a decisive moment that Noah warned about, it was a single point in time that once started, nothing would stop. The decisive moment is

Genesis 7:7

“And **Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons’ wives with him went into the ark to escape the waters of the flood.**” (ESV)

Genesis 7:16

“And those that entered, male and female of all flesh, went in as God had commanded him. And the LORD shut him in.” (ESV)

Right now, the signs of the second coming of Jesus Christ are becoming, for anyone who chooses to be watching and waiting, incredibly clear. Watching a barge coming together pointed to a coming judgment.



Seeing all of the animals beginning to gather would be another sign. How normal is it for there to be giants wandering around everywhere? That, for those who were around prior to the fallen ones showing up, would have remembered the then versus now, and they ignored that as well.

But remember this, 125 years of warning and then, judgment. The time for the offer to get on board was limited.

Because we see what is going on with the signs of the second coming all converging in terms of fulfillment, we know the time is indeed very short. Since we know and we are prepared, “give careful attention to spiritual life—not allowing the cares of life to produce complacency lest that day (a short form designation for “Day of the Lord” tribulation events) come upon you like a trap, for it will come upon all who dwell on the earth. Instead, pray to be able to escape all these tribulation events that must occur, and to stand before the Son of Man (Luke 21:34–36).” (Wenger 2014, 134)

The Days of Noah did indeed also include sex, demons and depravity, giants, and fallen angels coming to earth as benevolent beings. They weren’t. There was also, a warning which was ignored by the vast majority.

Today we warn and talk about the impending return of Jesus Christ for his church. But more and more in the church have turned away from that doctrine in favor of other things. In fact there are those who seem to go out of their way to make comments about those of us who believe in and teach the pre-tribulation rapture. And they allege to do it for God. Peter said this would happen.

2 Peter 3:3–7

“Most importantly, I want to remind you that in the last days scoffers will come, mocking the truth and following their own desires. They will say, “What happened to the promise that Jesus is coming again? From before the times of our ancestors, everything has remained the same since the world was first created.” They deliberately forget that God made the heavens long ago by the word of his command, and he brought the earth out from the water and surrounded it with water. Then he used the water to destroy the ancient world with a mighty flood. And by the same word, the present heavens and earth have been stored up for fire. They are being kept for the day of judgment, when ungodly people will be destroyed.” (NLT)

Peter tells us that those of us who believe in the doctrine of the pretribulation rapture of the church will be mocked. Shades of Noah warning about a flood.

The mocking centering around uniformitarianism is also exhibited by their denial of the flood as well as denial of an actual creation of the earth.

That is basically an embracing of naturalism and a rejection of supernaturalism, which the Bible accepts as a known. Everything is natural, and nothing supernatural, either in the outward world or in the sphere of things spiritual. There can be no creation “ex nihilo,” no miracles, no immediate revelation, no inspiration in the church sense of that term; no supernatural work upon the heart, and therefore no regeneration in the sense of an immediate operation of almighty power on the soul. (Hodge 1997, 37)

The result is dead religion. Or in other words the church of Sardis, the church of dead religion and Laodicea, the last days church of feel-good religion but no relationship with the creator or the one whom we are waiting to take us to be with Him for all eternity. Days of Noah for sure.
