# Home Field Advantage

#### **Ephesians 6:1-2 (NLT)**

Children, obey your parents because you belong to the Lord, for this is the right thing to do. "Honor your father and mother."

This is the first commandment with a promise: If you honor your father and mother, "things will go well for you, and you will have a long life on the earth."

People who have been hurt tell themselves <u>lies</u> in order to <u>survive</u>

We Have to Remember:

#### **Ephesians 4:30 (NLT)**

And do not bring sorrow to God's Holy Spirit by the way you live. Remember, he has identified you as his own, guaranteeing that you will be saved on the day of redemption.

We Have to Remember:

- Remember who you are: SONS and DAUGHTERS of God
- Remember God's promise: <u>SALVATION</u>.

#### **Ephesians 4:31 (NLT)**

Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you.

We were created to care.

Caring is a <u>losing</u> <u>battle</u>.

## 2 Corinthians 5:14-21 (NLT)

Either way, Christ's love controls us. Since we believe that Christ died for all, we also believe that we have all died to our old life. He

died for everyone so that those who receive his new life will no longer live for themselves. Instead, they will live for Christ, who died and was raised for them.

So we have **stopped evaluating others** from a human point of view. At one time we thought of Christ merely from a human point of view. How differently we know him now! This means that anyone who **belongs to Christ** has become **a new person**. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!

And all of this is a **gift from God**, who **brought us back** to himself **through Christ.** And God has given us this task of reconciling people to him.

For God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, **no longer** counting people's sins against them. And he gave us this wonderful message of reconciliation. So we are Christ's ambassadors; God is making his appeal through us. We speak for Christ when we plead, "Come back to God!"

For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the **offering for our** sin, so that we could be **made right with God** through Christ.

caring is a losing battle... that is worth fighting.

Reconciliation = Partnership (bonding) of <u>UNEQUAL</u> parts.
