Luke 11:1

One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When he finished, one of his disciples said to him, **"Lord, teach us to pray,** just as John taught his disciples."

Lots of people come to the conclusion that prayer just <u>DOESN'T</u> <u>WORK</u>!

Matthew 6:5-15

"And **when you pray,** do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But **when you pray,** go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

Question: If God already knows... why pray?

Matthew 6:9-10 *"This, then, is how you should pray: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom* come, *your will* be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

The purpose of Prayer: Prayer is about <u>LETTING GO</u>... a true <u>SURRENDER</u> of my will

Prayer is not: A method or tool to <u>FORCE</u> God's hand

Luke 22:42 *"not my will, but yours be done"* If Prayer is about anything other than <u>SURRENDER</u>, we are doing it wrong!

What if you are <u>PART</u> of the plan but the plan is way <u>BIGGER</u> than you?
