Ezekiel 3:1-3 NLT

On July 31 of my thirtieth year, while I was with the Judean exiles beside the Kebar River in Babylon, the heavens were opened and I saw visions of God. ² This happened during the fifth year of King Jehoiachin's captivity. ³ (The LORD gave this message to Ezekiel son of Buzi, a priest, beside the Kebar River in the land of the Babylonians, and he felt the hand of the LORD take hold of him.)



Ezekiel in the Badlands

 The Jews' capital city has been ransacked, their beloved Temple desecrated and pillaged, and their best and brightest enslaved

• Psalm 137:1

"By the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down and wept when we remembered Zion." [HCSB]



Ezekiel in the Badlands

- His generational inheritance is that he is a son of rejection and contempt
- This is where the most powerful experience of God Ezekiel will ever have occurs: in the middle of the badlands with no relief in sight



- Ezekiel, in the badlands of captivity and poverty and national depression, sees the heavens open and has visions of God
- Verse 3b "the hand of the LORD was upon him there" NKJV
 - "there" = lowest, worst place he'd everbeen
 - "hand of the LORD" indicates that God gained complete mastery over Ezekiel, so that he could be described as a man seized by God



- The badlands are his training ground for being a son of the Father
- John Calvin: "The hand of God, then, was a proof of new favor." No one gets favor like a son or a daughter!



- Your badlands? God will use them to master you with his love and affirm your true identity as a son, as a daughter, and to bring you into new favor
- Your badlands? If you're willing, in that desolate place God may give you the most powerful spiritual experience of your life these undesired badlands may be God's choicest place for revelation!



- Ezekiel's breakthrough happens at the badlands' riverbanks, in community
- Maybe that's why God is calling us back to prayer, because he's making us into sons and daughters who stand with each other and believe, even in the badlands
- When things are hard and hope is elusive, that's when sons and daughters forge a trail blazed on a sure confidence in Father's love

The Kind of God We Have

- Jesus points us not to the kind of praying we do but to the kind of God we have
- Matthew 7:11
 - "So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good gifts to those who ask him."
- So: keep on asking, seeking, knocking, but not as an obligation or a burden. Rather, as an invitation to a truer, more authentic life with your Father
