The Context for the Story

• Acts 10:22 PASSION "Cornelius, a Roman military captain, ... sent us to find you. He is a devout man of the highest integrity who worships God and is respected throughout the Jewish community. He was divinely instructed through the appearance of an angel to summon you to his home and to listen to the message that you would bring him."

The Arc of the Story

- Acts 10:44-48
- Luke indicates that across racial and cultural lines we share a co-humanity that binds us together equally before God and with each other
- The three conversions of Acts 8, 9, & 10 are of a black man, a Jew, and a gentile

Galatians 3:28-29 THE MESSAGE

"In Christ's family there can be no division into Jew and non-Jew, slave and free, male and female. Among us you are all equal. That is, we are all in a common relationship with Jesus Christ. Our Common Call


