The present imperative tense in Matthew 7:7 issues a command that a person should always do something or should go on doing something

Asking, Seeking, Knocking

Jesus is not saying to pray harder or better, and maybe then God will be persuaded to act. He's saying something quite different: "Keep it up. Don't stop. Keep your prayers short and to the point, and don't play act or perform. Just keep going after it."
