Arising Church has had the privilege of following in the footsteps of LCM's Exodus teaching as we studied the situation that the Israelites found themselves in at the Red Sea.




Exodus 14:1-4 (NIV 1984)

- 1 Then the LORD said to Moses,
- 2 "Tell the Israelites to turn back and encamp near Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea. They are to encamp by the sea, directly opposite Baal Zephon.
- 3 Pharaoh will think, 'The Israelites are wandering around the land in confusion, hemmed in by the desert.'
- 4 And I will harden Pharaoh's heart, and he will pursue them. But I will gain glory for myself through Pharaoh and all his army, and the Egyptians will know that I am the LORD." So the Israelites did this.

God intentionally led His people into what looked like a trap, only to draw Pharaoh out so that he would strike at the Israelites. God knew exactly what He was doing the whole time, but His people seemed to be in a vulnerable position.

All of this was so that God would gain maximum glory by drawing out the enemy only to crush his head.



We are not afraid of the position that we are in, because we know that our God is only drawing out the enemy so that we can crush his head and today we want to share with you how we are going to do that.

JOINING FORCES

The Lord is helping us understand the times that we are living in and what we must do in response to His Word and the leading of His Spirit. We are going to take you through several passages to help build our response to His leading.

Numbers 10 NIV

Numbers 10:1-7 (NIV 1984)

- 1 The LORD said to Moses:
- 2 "Make two trumpets of hammered silver, and use them for calling the community together and for having the camps set out.
- 3 When both are sounded, the whole community is to assemble before you at the entrance to the Tent of Meeting.
- 4 If only one is sounded, the leaders—the heads of the clans of Israel—are to assemble before you.
- 5 When a trumpet blast is sounded, the tribes camping on the east are to set out.
- 6 At the sounding of a second blast, the camps on the south are to set out. The blast will be the signal for setting out.
- 7 To gather the assembly, blow the trumpets, but not with the same signal.
- -two trumpet blasts with different sounds were used to gather the community
- -when the larger community heard the first trumpet, they waited...when the leaders heard the first trumpet, they responded

sound the alarm on my holy hill. Let all who live in the land tremble, for the day of the LORD is coming. It is close at hand—a day of darkness and gloom, a day of clouds and blackness. Like dawn spreading across the mountains a large and mighty army comes, such as never was in ancient times nor ever will be in ages to come. Before them fire devours, behind them a flame blazes. Before them the land is like the garden of Eden, behind them, a desert waste—nothing escapes them.

READ HERE

"Even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting and weeping and mourning." Rend your heart and not your garments. Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love, and he relents from sending calamity. Who knows? He may turn and relent and leave behind a blessing—grain offerings and drink offerings for the LORD your God. Blow the trumpet in Zion

• 1 Corinthians 7:26-35 NIV (look at NLT)

26 Because of the present crisis, I think that it is good for a man to remain as he is. 27 Are you pledged to a woman? Do not seek to be released. Are you free from such a commitment? Do not look for a wife. 28 But if you do marry, you have not sinned; and if a virgin marries, she has not sinned. But those who marry will face many troubles in this life, and I want to spare you this.

29 What I mean, brothers and sisters, is that the time is short. From now on those who have wives should live as if they do not; 30 those who mourn, as if they did not; those who are happy, as if they were not; those who buy something, as if it were not theirs to keep; 31 those who use the things of the world, as if not engrossed in them. The Kibbutz operates under the premise that all income generated by the Kibbutz and its members goes into a common pool. This income is used to run the Kibbutz, make investments, and guarantee mutual and reciprocal aid and responsibility between members. Kibbutz members receive the same budget (according to family size), regardless of their job or position. In terms of education, all children start equally and are given equal opportunity.

Today there are approximately 250 Kibbutzim in the country, where about 125 000 people live.

War effort and borders

Kibbutzniks played a role in yishuv society and then Israeli society, far out of proportion to their population, and many kibbutzniks have served Israel in positions of leadership. The invention of the Tower and Stockade system by which 52 settlements from 1938 to 1947 largely decided the borders of Israel in the UN 29 November 1947 decision, is attributed to kibbutz member Shlomo Gur.^[65]

The establishment of the Palmach underground army in 1942, which won the yishuv crucial military struggle against Palestinian Arabs from 30 November 1947 up to 15 May 1948 that made possible the establishment of the Israeli state, was due to efforts by Tabenkin and other Kibbutz Meuchad leaders. One of them, Yigal Allon and Kibbutz Artzi member Shimon Avidan were the two most important commanders who won the 1948 war, and numerous kibbutz members were Cabinet Ministers who largely shaped Israeli politics from 1955 to 1977. [64] Kibbutz-born Ehud Barak was Prime Minister from 1999 to 2001, and David Ben-Gurion lived most of his life in Tel Aviv, but joined Kibbutz Sde Boker in the Negev after resigning as Prime Minister in 1953. He remained a member after his return to office in 1955.

Mark 10:17-27 NIV

- 17 As Jesus started on his way, a man ran up to him and fell on his knees before him. "Good teacher," he asked, "what must I do to inherit eternal life?"
- 18 "Why do you call me good?" Jesus answered. "No one is good—except God alone. 19 You know the commandments: 'You shall not murder, you shall not commit adultery, you shall not steal, you shall not give false testimony, you shall not defraud, honor your father and mother."

"From time to time...as he had need" God still allowed people to experience "need"

Acts 4:36-37 (NIV 1984)

- 36 Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means Son of Encouragement),
- 37 sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet.
- -Joseph is a levite

This means that his original destiny was to serve as a priest in Israel owning no land.

This man was living outside of Israel in Cyprus

The implication would be that because of recent events, i.e. Pentecost, this man was filled with the Spirit of God and decided move back home to Israel...this is BARNABAS!

Once he arrived he decided to sell his land back in Cyprus, this is like burning the ships, no going back, he wasn't just selling land, he was giving his life

There is no chapter break here...these two stories are to be contrasted and compared

Ananias & Sapphira — Acts 5:1-11 NIV

Now a man named Ananias, together with his wife Sapphira, also sold a piece of property. 2 With his wife's full knowledge he kept back part of the money for himself, but brought the rest and put it at the apostles' feet.

3 Then Peter said, "Ananias, how is it that Satan has so filled your heart that you have lied to the Holy Spirit and have kept for yourself some of the money you received for the land? 4 Didn't it belong to you before it was sold? And after it was sold, wasn't the money at your disposal? What made you think of doing such a thing? You have not lied just to human beings but to God."

5 When Ananias heard this, he fell down and died. And great fear seized all who heard what had happened. 6 Then some young men came forward, wrapped up his body, and carried him out and buried him.

7 About three hours later his wife came in, not knowing what had happened. 8 Peter asked her, "Tell me, is this the price you and Ananias got for the land?"

"Yes," she said, "that is the price."

9 Peter said to her, "How could you conspire to test the Spirit of the Lord? Listen! The feet of the men who buried your husband are at the door, and they will carry you out also."

10 At that moment she fell down at his feet and died. Then the young men came in and, finding her dead, carried her out and buried her beside her husband. 11 Great fear seized the whole church and all who heard about these events.

 something rich that we could initially overlook in a casual reading. Luke is saying directly
 !!! This widow is actually declaring through these words I GIVE MY LIFE !!! This is no
 reservation !!
- Here is what the Spirit is causing us to consider as we ponder all that the Lord has spoken to us in these days. The "amount" is not the predominate issue, though amounts are necessary. He is seeking to get our hearts in proper alignment. That is why He called together His disciples to teach them. You see this woman she is giving her life as Jesus instructs them Church- don't forget this very fundamental truth about Yahweh God of Israel!! He will multiply!! Consider the testimonies!! The thousands fed on very little seas parted // and don't wake up Monday morning and doubt the disciples did that and got on a boat and doubted the God of the universe could multiply their bread though they had just witnessed multiplication of epic proportions.
- Go to Matthew 20:20-28
- "Gave His life as a ransom for many"

1. The Greek does sound more extreme than most English renderings

The literal wording in Greek —

πάντα τὸν βίον ὃν εἶχεν (panta ton bion hon eichen, "all the life which she had") — really does sound radical.

In Koine Greek, β io ζ can mean "life" in the concrete sense of one's *means of living* — food, money, property, everything that sustains survival. But Luke's deliberate word choice (instead of $\chi \rho \dot{\eta} \mu \alpha \tau \alpha$, "money," or $o\dot{u}o$ i α , "possessions") heightens the emotional and theological impact: she gave *her very life*.

That's not metaphorical fluff — it's the same nuance you'd find if someone said today, "she gave her last breath to God."

2. Why translators softened it

Most English translators render it as "all she had to live on" or "her livelihood" because:

- They're aiming for **functional clarity** to make it clear this refers to material means, not suicide or self-harm.
- English idiom doesn't naturally convey "she gave her life" without implying physical death.
- They try to avoid confusing readers who might take "life" literally when the context is about **giving money**.
