INTRODUCTION: SEEKING TO UNDERSTAND (video)

THE "COLUMBO APPROACH" TO WITNESSING (video)

• As Professor Paustian shares three types of questions you can use while witnessing, jot down the purpose of each type of question as he explains it.

Type 1: "What do you mean by...?" / "What does it mean when you say...?" / "Help me understand this..."

Type 2: "Why do you think this is true?" / "How have you come to think that way?"

Type 3: "Have you thought about...?"

PLAYING THE DETECTIVE (exercise)

• Find a partner and practice role-playing the Columbo Approach in which one plays the skeptic whose position is that Christians are hypocrites. After a few minutes switch roles.

- 1.) Describe what just happened? What was challenging for you? What worked well? What did you learn?
- 2.) Was it easy or hard to play the role of the skeptic? Why might that be?
- 3.) How will this sort of activity help you in your life as Christ's own ambassador?

PUTTING OPEN QUESTIONS INTO PRACTICE / PREVIEW (video)

HOMEWORK: Spend some time this week asking the Christians in your life open questions about themselves and their faith-life. Remember that open questions start with "What..." "How..." "Tell me about..." or "Help me understand..."

Some possible examples....

- o Tell me a hymn verse or Scripture that means so much to you right now.
- What should I be praying for when I think of you?
- Where is God in all your struggles? What is happening with your faith right now?
- o Others...?
