A Study of the Book of Job: When Bad Things Happen to God's People

Lesson 3: Job's Further Trials (Chapter 2)

IMPORTANT TERMS & CONCEPTS

- v. 1: LORD: this name emphasizes that he is the forgiving and faithful God of free grace
- v. 1: Satan: name means "enemy, adversary" (14 of 19x in OT is in Job); devil means "accuser"
- v. 3, 9: blameless, integrity: come from same Hebrew root (口页) meaning "complete/whole" w/o hypocrisy
- v. 8: ashes/dust: either in the dirt or the (burning) waste heaps in front of a village
- v. 10: foolish: signifies a moral/spiritual deficiency (opposite of godly wisdom in Proverbs)

BIBLE STUDY

Ch. 2:1-6

- 1.) What similarity do you see between Satan's answer to God in verse 2 and the Apostle Peter's description of Satan in **1 Peter 5:8** "Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour"?
- 2.) How does the LORD again challenge Satan? What is Satan's response? How well does he know our weakened human nature?
- 3.) Who is in control of what has happened to Job? How do you know (v. 3, 5, 6)?

Ch. 2:7-10

- 1.) Many Bible expositors identify Job's loathsome disease as elephantiasis, a severe form of leprosy, which causes thickening of the skin and extreme inflammation. Job further describes agonies that accompanied his affliction:
- insufferable itching of the skin so that he scraped himself with pottery (2:8)
- skin cracked and covered with boils, that later cracked and became infested with worms or maggots (7:5)
- foul breath (19:17)
- blackened and chapped appearance of his body (30:30)
- pain in his limbs (30:17, 30)
- extreme emaciation of his body (19:20; 30:18)
- anguish, nightmares, gasping and tortures (7:4, 13-15)
