A. What is the biblical view of government?

- 1. The <u>Triune</u> God establishes government as <u>His</u> servants to provide structures for the governance of people. (Romans 13:1-7; Colossians 1:16-18)
- 2. God establishes <u>all</u> governments for <u>His</u> purposes. (Daniel 2:20-21, 4:17, 5:21; Romans 13:1)

B. What is the biblical view regarding the role of the Church?

- The Church is to <u>proclaim</u> the gospel, make <u>disciples</u> of <u>all</u> nations, and to be His witnesses. (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 1:8)
- The Church is to <u>help</u> believers grow in the knowledge of Christ to help them become <u>mature</u> in Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-13)

C. How should the Church interact with government?

- 1. The Church is to proclaim the gospel by <u>all</u> means <u>regardless</u> of the government's laws. (Acts 4:19-20)
- 2. The <u>Church</u> is to submit to government leaders and humbly obey human laws until the point government laws violate God's directives and laws. (1 Peter 2:13; Acts 5:29)
- 3. The Church should <u>pray</u> for those in authority, both the <u>good</u> and <u>evil</u>. (1 Timothy 2:2)

- D. What should the mindset be of the Christian if the government is completely against the Church and Christians?
 - Expect <u>persecution</u>; it's a given. Decisions that result in <u>martyrdom</u> need not be feared. We know the last chapter. (Matthew 5:11; 2 Timothy 3:12)
 - While Christians are citizens of earthly nations in this life, it is necessary to remember our <u>heavenly</u> citizenship (Philippians 3:20), which is eternal, cannot be taken from us. As <u>ambassadors</u>, we are to boldly and humbly share the grace of God and the truth of the gospel. (2 Corinthians 5:17-21)
 - Scripture indicates that when a decision needs to be made that would result in civil disobedience, an individual has the option to either <u>suffer</u>, <u>defend</u>, or <u>flee</u>. (Acts 7:56-60, 22:1; Matthew 24:15-20)
 - 4. Whenever possible, Christians are to use their <u>existing</u> <u>rights</u> as citizens to speak God's truth to those unjust in government and challenge unjust laws as Paul did when claiming his Roman citizenship. (Acts 22:22-27)
