What happened to Paul after Acts 28?

The most accepted theory: He was released after two years of house arrest in Rome and traveled on a fourth missionary journey throughout the Mediterranean.

- Macedonia (1 Timothy 1:3)
- Troas (2 Timothy 4:13)
- Miletus (2 Timothy 4:20)
- Crete (Titus 1:5)
- Nicopolis (Titus 3:12)
- Possibly Spain

Eventually, he ended up back in Rome where he wrote 2 Timothy, his last known letter. He was executed, probably by beheading, sometime between AD 66 and 68 under Emperor Nero.

Why does Acts end so abruptly?

Because the mission of Acts continues to this day!
