- A. Why does CBC only have male elders and pastors?
 - Jesus chose <u>male</u> leadership on which to build the Church. (Luke 6:12-16)
 - An elder must be a <u>husband</u> of one wife. (1 Timothy 3:1-7)
 - Male leadership in the Church and home was God's plan from the <u>beginning</u>. (1 Timothy 2:11-14; Ephesians 5:22-24)

B. Is God chauvinistic? Does God value men over women?

- God created male and female in His image giving worth and value to both. (Genesis 1:27; Matthew 19:4)
- Jesus submitted to God the Father, but this did not mean Jesus was <u>less</u> than the Father. (John 6:38; Mark 14:36)

 In Christ's Kingdom, leadership is not about power, control, or perks but is about <u>serving</u>, <u>protecting</u>, and putting yourself last. (Mark 10:35-45)

*Our worldly perspective views those in leadership as more important or better than those they serve. This is not God's perspective.

- 4. Jesus was <u>pro-women</u> in a culture that minimized the dignity of women and depersonalized them.
 - Jesus spoke freely to women in public. (John 4:27, 8:10-11; Luke 7:12-13)
 - Jesus ministered to the needs of women.
 (Mark 1:30-31; Luke 13:10-17; Matthew 9:20-22)
 - Jesus allowed women to minister to Him and with Him. (Matthew 26:6-13; Luke 8:2-3, 10:40; John 12:2-3)
 - Jesus addressed women tenderly placing them on the same spiritual plane as men. (Luke 13:16)
 - Jesus' teaching on divorce treated women as people, not property. (Matthew 5:32, 19:9)
 - Jesus taught women.
 (Luke 10:38-42, 23:27-31)

Conclusion: Jesus honored women and empowered them for ministry, but when it came to selecting those for positions of leadership and authority, He chose only men.
