While it's not likely that all of these questions will be asked during your small group meeting, we believe that your personal walk with Christ will be strengthened as you meditate upon the truths that God is teaching you through His Word.

1. When you have something important to share, what's your favorite means of communication? Do you prefer talking over a cup of coffee, posting on Social Media, or something different? Why?
2. What exactly did Jesus command in the Great Commission? How would you succinctly summarize this whole passage in just a few words?
3. The commands in these verses are for all followers of Jesus. As you examine your own life, what word would you use to describe your involvement in the process of making disciples? Why?
 - a. What is your next step in obeying this command?
4. What holds you back from fulfilling God's mission for your life? What motivations drive you forward?
5. What are the two parts of making disciples? Which one is hardest for you? What are some action steps you can take to grow in this?
6. What role does disciple-making play in your day-to-day life?
7. What comes to mind when you think about evangelism or sharing your faith? Has your experience been positive or negative?
8. What is one of the most challenging things for you about evangelism?
9. Do you feel prepared to make disciples? How challenging does it sound to you? What are your roadblocks?
10. Who has been instrumental in teaching you about Jesus and the gospel? How can their example serve as instruction in making disciples?
