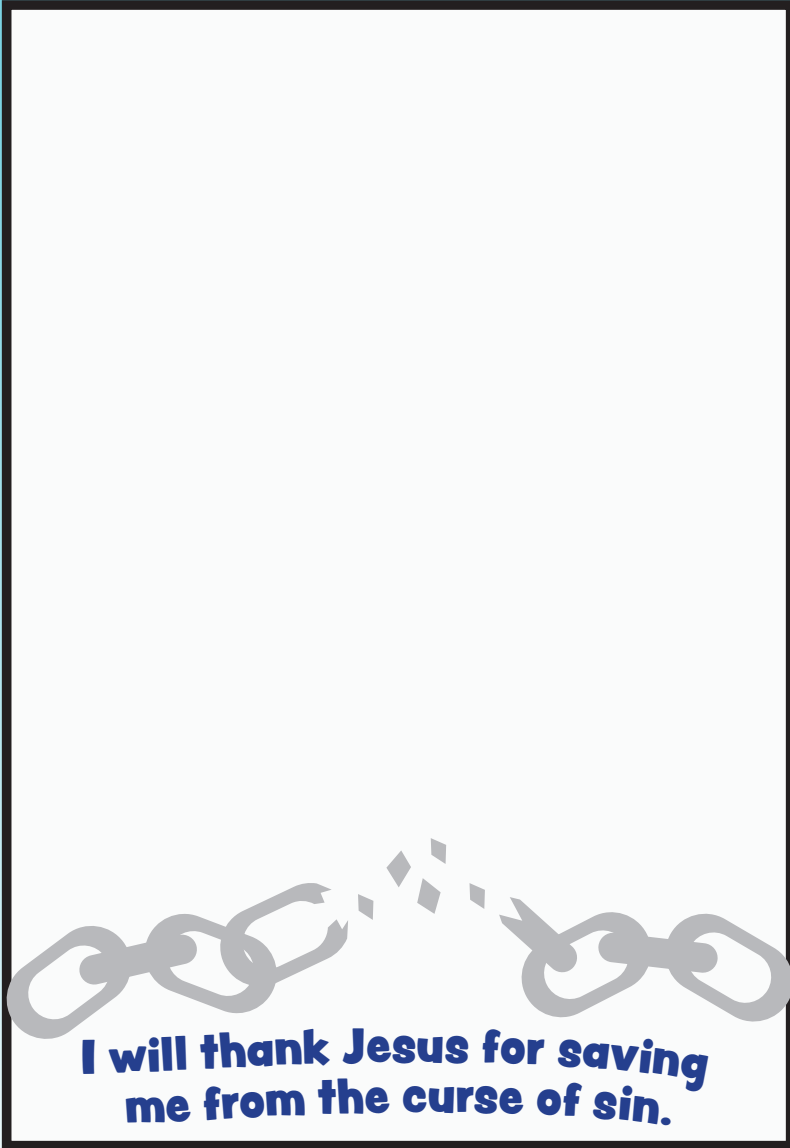


A Way out of the Mess

Genesis 3:1–7; Romans 5:17–19: A Way Out of the Mess

Genesis 3:1–7 (paraphrase)

After making Adam and Eve, God placed them in the beautiful Garden of Eden with one rule: “You can eat from any tree except the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil.”

One day, the shrewd serpent slithered up to Eve and hissed, “Did God say you could eat from any tree in the garden?”

“Every tree except that one,” Eve replied, pointing at the forbidden tree. “Fruit from that tree will kill us.”

“You won’t die,” the serpent responded. “God knows the fruit from that tree will open your eyes. You’ll be as wise as Him.”

Eve looked at the fruit—it looked and smelled delicious, and she sure did want to be wise like God. *Crunch!* “Adam,” she cried out. “This is so good, you simply must taste it.”

Adam took the fruit from his wife. *Crunch!* At that moment their eyes were opened; they knew they had disobeyed God. As punishment, God kicked them out of the Garden of Eden, but from that point in history, God had a plan to restore relationship with His creation—Jesus.
