

Psalm 34 (King James Version)

- ¹I will bless the LORD at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth.
- ² My soul shall make her boast in the LORD: the humble shall hear thereof, and be glad.

I Samuel 21:10–15; 22:1–5 (paraphrase)
