Genesis 22:1–19: Abraham Gives to God

God made a promise to Abram. Even though he and his wife Sarai were getting very old, they would have a baby. God also changed their names to Abraham and Sarah. The promise came to pass, and Sarah had a baby boy named Isaac.

When Isaac got older, God gave Abraham a test to see if he would obey. God told Abraham to take Isaac on a three-day journey to a certain mountain where Abraham was to offer Isaac as a sacrifice to God. As they approached the mountain, Abraham told the servants to stay behind. He and Isaac went up the mountain.

As they climbed, Isaac asked, “Dad, we have the wood and the fire, but where is our sacrifice?” Abraham, in faith, said, “God will provide a lamb for the sacrifice.”

At the top of the mountain, Abraham built an altar and laid the wood on it. Then in obedience to God’s command, Abraham bound Isaac and laid him on the altar. God saw Abraham being faithful and didn’t really want Abraham to kill Isaac. He was testing Abraham’s faith.

God called, “Abraham, Abraham! Don’t touch your boy. I have seen your obedience, and I am pleased.” Then Abraham saw a ram with its horns caught in the nearby bushes. Together, Abraham and Isaac sacrificed the ram on the altar and worshiped God.

Because of Abraham’s faith, God promised to bless the entire world through his children. Abraham called the place *Jehovah-Jireh*, which means “God shall supply all my needs.” God saw Abraham’s faith and supplied the sacrifice that was needed.
