God alone sits on the throne in Heaven and will rule forever.

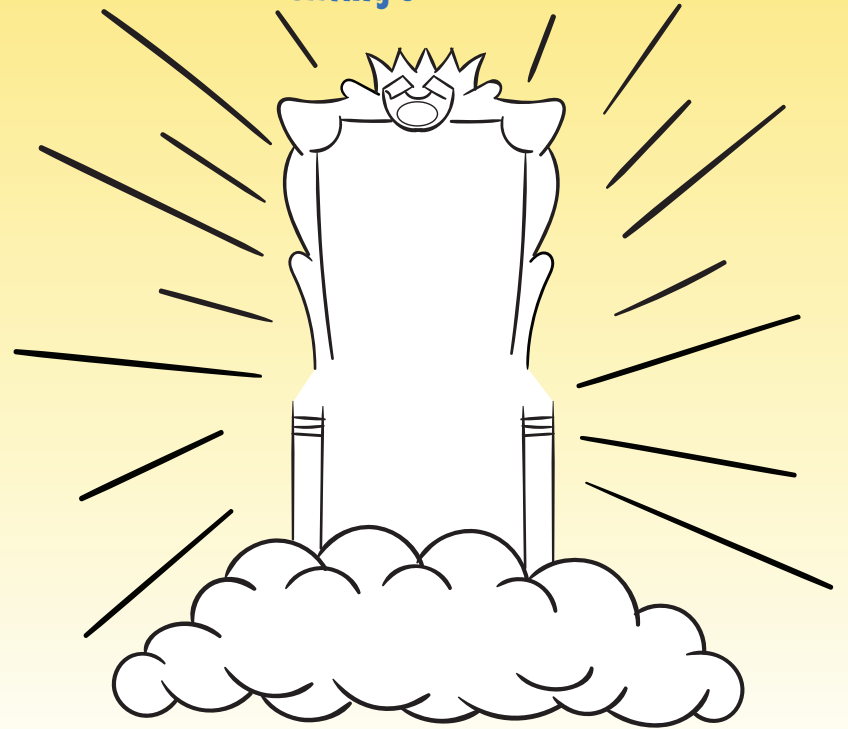

## Revelation 21:1–22:5: Jesus on the Throne

In the Book of Revelation, John wrote about what he saw in a vision—a new Heaven and a new Earth. In John’s revelation, Jesus was coming to gather His bride—the church. God promises to wipe away every tear because Heaven will not be a place of sadness.

Jesus is the Alpha and Omega—the beginning and ending. He is the start of everything and the end of everything. As the Lamb of God, He is all there is. No god stands beside Him. There is no god except the one true God—King Jesus.

Unfortunately, sin separates us from God. If we don’t follow God’s plan of salvation by letting the blood of Jesus cover our sins, we will not live with Him forever.

In John’s vision, a city came down from God called New Jerusalem. It had tall walls with twelve gates. Each gate was guarded by an angel and had the name of a tribe of Israel. The walls were laid on twelve foundation stones. The city was approximately 1,400 miles in length and height. The walls were made of precious stones, like jasper, sapphire, emerald, and amethyst. The gates were made of pearls. The streets were made of pure gold.

Only those whose names are written in the Lamb’s Book of Life can enter into this city. To get our names in that book, we must follow God’s plan of salvation.

Jesus is the Lamb who takes away the sin of the world. Jesus died on the cross to save the world from the curse of sin. After He died, He rose again and lives in Heaven. He alone sits on the throne in Heaven.
