

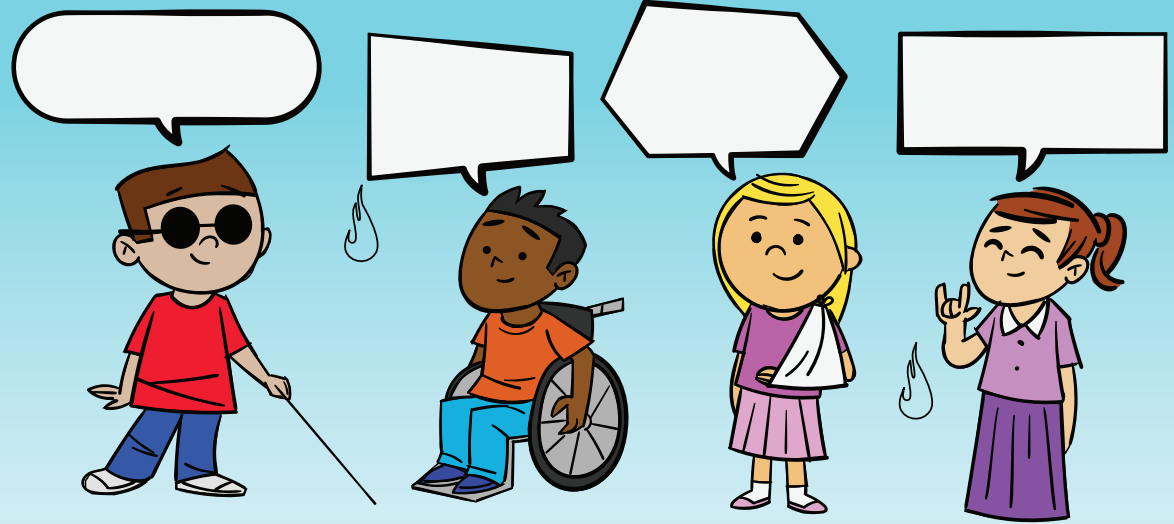
Holy Ghost Power

Acts 1:6–11; 2:1–39: Holy Ghost Power

Acts 1:3–15 (paraphrased)

They crucified Jesus on the Passover. For three days His dead body lay in a tomb. Then He came back to life!

For forty days after His resurrection, Jesus appeared to His followers to teach about the Kingdom of God: “Don’t leave Jerusalem until you receive the Promise of the Father. John baptized with water, but you will receive the Holy Ghost.” His followers heard Him, but didn’t quite understand.

One day on the Mount of Olives, they impatiently asked, “As king of the Jews, when are you going rule over Israel?”

He replied, “That’s not for you to know right now. It’s more important for you to be filled with the Holy Ghost. By the power of the Holy Spirit, you will be my witnesses to the entire world.”

Then Jesus ascended into the air. His disciples watched Him go up, up, up into a cloud. As they gawked skyward, two white-robed men stood among them saying, “Why are you standing here staring into the sky? Jesus has gone into Heaven, and one day He will return just as you saw Him go.”

Then the disciples remembered Jesus’ teaching, “Don’t leave Jerusalem until you receive the Promise of the Father.” One hundred twenty of Jesus’ closest followers returned to the city, gathering day and night for prayer in an upper room. For seven long days, they petitioned God to send the Promise of the Father.

Fifty days after Jesus was crucified—on the Day of Pentecost—that promise would arrive.
