






Meals for Congregation Members – From Congregational Care Leader Amy Ashwood

As a former teacher, my "New Year" always started with September. So does our church calendar. So, in that spirit, with a new year starting, have you been thinking of ways that you could be of service to our church family? I may have an idea for you. Our Meal Ministry was put on pause during Covid, but we are starting it up again. We've discovered an app, called Meal Train, that can help us as a need arises. Lee Hansen and Shirley Bohland's situations have given us the opportunity to try out this new system. It works like this:

- I type in the need, contact information, indicate the dates meals are needed, and include any useful information like dietary needs or restrictions.
- Then I share the link with our church family and if it is something that works for you, then you can sign up and indicate what you will bring.
- It generates a message to the person in need, to me and offers you a chance to link it to your own electronic calendar.
- · Call the recipient to arrange a convenient drop-off time.
- How convenient is that?

Don't know what to fix? You could browse through these links and find a recipe that would be appropriate to take. Pinch of Yum, Take Them a Meal, 15 recipes to Take to Someone,

Don't cook anymore? Then pick up a meal to go. Places like Bay Family Restaurant have quarts of soups to go. If you want, add some fruit, rolls, muffins or dessert, but it's not necessary.

Pack in small (non-returnable) containers so they can be eaten right away or put in the freezer.

Can't cook, but could run errands? That can be helpful, too!

Earlier this year, I had a stroke and was so appreciative of the meals and visits that came in from our church family, so now it's time to pass it on. It turned a pretty frightening period of time into a string of happy memories. We can all relate to those times when life can change in a heartbeat. I've included you on this mailing list, to offer you awareness. Can you help this time? Great, so sign up! Is it a time that won't work for you now? Ok, pass the email on to someone who you think can help. I'll be sending these out periodically, so when it's right for your family, we would love your participation. Sometimes we just need a nudge.
