Scripture Reading - Hebrews 5:1-10

¹ Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. ² He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness, ³ and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. ⁴ And one does not presume to take this honor but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

⁵ So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest but was appointed by the one who said to him,

“You are my Son;
today I have begotten you”;

⁶ as he says also in another place,

“You are a priest forever,
according to the order of Melchizedek.”

⁷ In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. ⁸ Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered, ⁹ and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, ¹⁰ having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

DISASTER RESPONSE

The United Methodist Committee On Relief | Global Ministries

For more than **80 years**, the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) has responded to disasters in the United States and around the world and helps address the suffering of individuals, families, and communities affected by both natural and human-made disasters.

UMCOR journeys with communities throughout a disaster's cycle, including disaster preparedness, relief, response, recovery and mitigation. Through a strong network of worldwide partners, UMCOR quickly assesses needs in the **wake of disaster**. UMCOR comes alongside communities at their invitation and encourages their involvement in and ownership of their recovery. UMCOR works collaboratively with local partners to connect survivors to the help they need to rebuild their lives. UMCOR remains on the scene often for **months** and **years** after the disaster to help in the rebuilding process.
