

Exultate, jubilate (K.165) by Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

Mozart composed this motet for solo voice in 1773, at the age of seventeen, while he was in Milan for the production of one of his early operas, *Lucio Silla*. Mozart enjoyed the singing facility of one of the performers in the opera, the castrato Venanzio Rauzzini; Mozart wrote *Exultate, jubiltate* for him. Rauzzini sang the first performance at the Theatine Church in Milan on January 17, 1773. In 1780, wrote Mozart a revision to the first two movements of the work, with Trinitarian text, which was first performed at the Holy Trinity Church in Salzburg, Austria on May 30, 1779, Trinity Sunday. The first version will be sung at today's service.

The piece is in four movements: "Exultate, jubiltate" (aria); "Fulget amica dies" (recitative); "Tu virginum corona" (aria), and "Alleluja" (aria). Those familiar with arias in Mozart's operas will recognize this piece to be in a very similar style. It was originally scored for a small orchestra. The libretto (text), in Latin, is from an unknown author, but may have been his friend Rauzzini. The text is as follows:

Exultate, jubiltate
o vos animae beatae,
dulcia cantica canendo,
cantui vestro respondendo,
psallant aethera cum me.

Fulget amica dies, jam fugere et nubile et procellae, exorta est justis inexspectata quies. Undique obscura regnabat nox, surgite tandem laeti qui timuistis adhuc, et jucundi aurorae fortunatae frondes dextera plena et lilia date.

Tu virginum corona, tu nobis pacem dona, tu consulare affectus, unde suspirat cor.

Alleluja!

Rejoice, resound with joy, o you blessed souls, singing sweet songs, in response to your singing Let the heavens sing forth with me.

The friendly day shines forth, both clouds and storms have fled now, for the righteous there has arisen an unexpected calm.

Dark night reigned everywhere (before), arise, happy at last, you who feared till now, and joyful for this lucky dawn, gave garlands and lilies with full right hand.

You, o crown of virgins, grant us peace, console our feelings, From which our hearts sigh.

Alleluia!

Dr. Yi-Lan Niu serves as Professor of Music at St. Norbert College in De Pere. A native of Taiwan, she began her music training at the age of four. Niu earned her Bachelor of Music in music education at the National Taipei University of Education, her Master of Music in vocal performance at the Eastman School of Music, and the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in vocal performance and opera production at the University of Wisconsin – Madison. Niu is a frequent solo performer locally, nationally, and abroad; many local audiences have heard her as a soloist with the Dudley Birder Chorale. As a performer, Niu presents a wide range of vocal music from Renaissance lute songs by John Dowland to the contemporary, minimalistic music of Steve Reich. Collaborating frequently with classical guitarist Dr. Christopher Cramer, Niu promotes a wide range of music written for voice and guitar.


