





NEW Community Shelter in July

Our church family has served at the NEW Community Shelter for over 20 years. In March and April of this year, our team has served more than 220 people each time. On average, this is 50 more folks than in recent memory. During both of these months, our planned meal has not covered the needs of those who have come to the shelter. The meals were supplemented by items the NEW Shelter had in place, so all have been served.

We will have our monthly night of service on **Tuesday, July 26**. We anticipate with the current cost of gas, groceries and inflation in general, the numbers will continue to be higher. We will need to purchase more food than we have in the past. Here are ways you can help us meet the needs of people who receive meals at the shelter:

- Provide 24 dessert servings. We need at least 10 people to provide these treats. The desserts may be homemade but need to be individually wrapped. Please bring them to church by Tuesday, July 26 at 12:00 PM.
- Make a designated gift to help cover the cost of our monthly meal.
