

An Outline of Luke 13:1-9

A ¹"There were present at that season some who told Him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. ² And Jesus answered and said to them, "Do you suppose that these Galileans were <u>worse sinners</u> than all *other* Galileans, because they suffered such things?

B ³ I tell you, no; but <u>unless you repent</u> you will all likewise perish.

A' ⁴Or those eighteen on whom the tower in Siloam fell and killed them, do you think that they were <u>worse sinners</u> than all *other* men who dwelt in Jerusalem?

B' ⁵I tell you, no; but <u>unless you repent</u> you will all likewise perish."

A ⁶ He also spoke this parable: "A certain *man* had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came <u>seeking fruit</u> on it and found none. ⁷ Then he said to the keeper of his vineyard, 'Look, for three years I have come <u>seeking fruit</u> on this fig tree and find none.

B Cut it down; why does it use up the ground?'

A' ⁸ But he answered and said to him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and fertilize *it*. ⁹ And if it bears fruit, well.

B' But if not, after that you can <u>cut it down</u>."
