

A Textual Outline of 2 Peter 2:10-16

The Thesis: ¹⁰They are presumptuous, self-willed.

A They are not afraid to <u>speak evil</u> of dignitaries, ¹¹ whereas angels, who are greater in power and might, do not bring a <u>reviling accusation</u> against them before the Lord.

B ¹² But these, like <u>natural brute beasts</u> made to be caught and destroyed, speak evil of the things they do not understand,

C and will <u>utterly perish</u> in their own corruption, ¹³ and will receive the wages of unrighteousness,

A' as those who count it pleasure to <u>carouse</u> in the daytime.

B' They are <u>spots and blemishes</u>, carousing in their own deceptions while they feast with you, ¹⁴ having eyes full of adultery and that cannot cease from sin, enticing unstable souls. They have a heart trained in covetous practices,

C' and are <u>accursed</u> children.

A' ¹⁵ They have <u>forsaken</u> the right way and <u>gone astray</u>,

B' following the way of <u>Balaam</u> the *son* of Beor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness;

C' ¹⁶ but he was <u>rebuked</u> for his iniquity: a dumb donkey speaking with a man's voice restrained the madness of the prophet.

Peter's Reminders in 2 Peter 2:10-16

- 2. Don't hang out with gossips, slanderers, or "Negative Nelly's."
- 3. Beware of the carousing types who may try to lure you in.
- 4. Steer clear of the greedy and covetous people; their influence for money is strong.
- 5. Take note of those who seem to gravitate towards the unrighteous things of the world.
- 6. Be a lover of the things that matter, the things that are eternal.

7. God is the Judge of all things. Don't take that on yourself. They will get what they deserve.
