What to do right after the service to help "the Word dwell more richly," within us (Colossians 3:16):

- 1. Instead of rushing off after the service is over, or talking about the latest news, develop the habit of talking about the sermon with people after church. Start spiritual conversations by asking, "How did the Scripture challenge or speak to you today?" Or "what about God in the message encouraged you?"
- 2. Encourage someone by sharing things you learned about God from His Word during the sermon. Make note of how your thinking has changed. Don't let biblical teaching be a one-time event that fades from memory as soon as it is over (James 1:22-25). Choose one or two particular applications to share.

## MIDWEEK DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The sermon noted that Joseph's "bad report" about his brothers was slanderous gossip motivated
by ill intentions, not just truthful reporting. How can we avoid the temptation to gossip or slander
others, even if some truth is involved? What are godly ways to address others' faults?

Jacob clearly showed sinful favoritism towards Joseph over his other sons. When have you seen or experienced the destructive effects of showing partiality or favoritism, whether in families, churches, workplaces or other contexts? How can we guard against this toxic tendency?

Joseph's youthful foolishness in flaunting his dreams made a bad situation worse with his brothers. When have you seen immaturity, insensitivity or lack of wisdom make a difficult circumstance even more inflamed? What does it look like to grow in wisdom in how we approach strained relationships?

Despite all the human brokenness and sin on display in this account, God was working providentially behind the scenes. When have you looked back and seen God's hand orchestrating something good through difficult circumstances you faced? How can this strengthen our faith in God's hidden workings?
