QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION AND FURTHER RESOURCES TO DIG DEEPER

MIDWEEK DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. The sermon highlights how God sometimes uses difficult circumstances to awaken our conscience and draw our attention to sin. Can you share a personal experience when God used challenging situations to convict you or bring you to a place of repentance? (See Hosea 5:15, Revelation 3:19)
- 2. The passage in Genesis shows Joseph's brothers initially lying and denying their wrongdoing towards him. Why do you think it's often so difficult for people to acknowledge their sins, even when confronted with evidence? How can we cultivate a posture of humility and openness to God's conviction? (See Jeremiah 17:9, James 5:16)
- 3. The sermon mentions the difference between having a heart of forgiveness and the act of forgiveness, which sometimes involves a process of repentance and owning up to sin. How can we strike a balance between being quick to forgive and ensuring that true repentance and reconciliation take place? (See Matthew 18:15-17, Luke 17:3-4)
- 4. The brothers' consciences were awakened through their encounter with Joseph, but ultimately, the sermon points to the gospel as the only way for our consciences to be truly cleansed and made alive. How has the power of the gospel transformed your own conscience and understanding of sin and forgiveness? (See Hebrews 9:14, 10:22, Titus 3:5)

What to do right after the service to help "the Word dwell more richly," within us (Colossians 3:16):
