## **Biblical Languages**

Abba — In Mark 14:36 Jesus refers to God as "Abba Father". Here he uses two terms for God, one which is Aramaic (abba) and one which was Greek (pater), but both meant "father". There is a little bit of debate about why Jesus uses both words. Some suggest it was merely for emphasis. Others think that by using the Aramaic word, it would have reminded those listening-in about the passages in the Old Testament that talk about God being our father. However, it is more likely that Jesus used 'abba' because it carries the idea of a close, intimate relationship. While the Greek word pater can mean intimacy, the Aramaic/Hebrew word abba always implies intimacy.

I will be a father to you, and you shall be sons and daughters to me, says the Lord Almighty. (2 Corinthians 6:18)
