- V. Transformation may be aided by human messengers. Vv. 11-17; 22:11-16; Matt. 28:19, 20
- VI. Transformation involves sovereign election. Vv. 15, 16; John 15:16; Eph. 2:10
- VII. Transformation results in gospel participation. Vv. 15
- VIII. Transformation requires personal confession. Vv. 17-18; 22:16; Acts 2:38
- IX. Transformation brings you into a new family relationship. Vv. 17; 22:13-14
- X. Transformation leads to a bold testimony and persuasive witness. Vv. 20-22; Acts 1:8; Matt. 28:18-20
