Hebrew Name	English Translation	Occurrences	Notes
Elohim	God, Creator	Occurs over 2000 times. It's first used in Genesis 1:1.	This name is God's most basic, primary name, and encompasses Him as Creator and Judge of the heavens and earth. He is eternal, sovereign, and transcendent, in time and place.
Adonai	Lord, Master	Occurs 434 times (200 times in Ezekiel alone and 11 times in Daniel 9). It's first used in Genesis 15:2.	This name encompasses the lordship (ownership) and dominion God has over His creation. It reminds us that we are completely dependent on Him. Adonai is often used as a substitute for YHWH, to avoid speaking the sacred name of God.
YHWH (Pronounced "Yahweh")	LORD or GOD (All caps)	Occurs 6519 times, more than any other name of God. It's first used in Genesis 2:4.	This is the sacred, promised name of God, first used in Genesis 2:4, but it's meaning is revealed to Moses in Exodus 3:14: I AM WHO I AM. He is unchanged and unaffected by outside factors. He's a relational God, and He desires to make Himself known to us.

Compounds of Elohim

El Shaddai	God Almighty	Occurs 7 times. It's first used in Genesis 17:1.	This name expresses God as the all-sufficient one. God completely nourishes, satisfies, and supplies His people with all their needs, as a mother would her child. He freely blesses and sustains us.
El Elyon	The Most High God	Occurs 28 times (19 in the Psalms). It's first used in Genesis 14:18.	This name expresses the extreme sovereignty and majesty of God and His highest preeminence. God is exalted above all.
El Roi	The God who Sees	Occurs one time, in Genesis 16:13-15	This name reminds us that God sees us and knows us intimately, more than we know ourselves. And because of that, He provides for us exactly what we need.
El Olam	The Everlasting God	Occurs 3 times. It's first used in Genesis 21:33.	Olam literally means, "forever" or "everlasting." It can also be translated, The God of the Universe or The God of Eternity.

Compounds of YHWH

YHWH Nissi	The LORD my Banner	Occurs one time, in Exodus 17:15.	This name reminds us that God fights our battles, and the victory is won. It also can be translated, The LORD my Miracle or The LORD my Refuge.
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YHWH Raah	The LORD my Shepherd	Occurs 4 times, most famously in Psalm 23.	This name expresses God's guidance over our lives. He leads us and provides for us, like a shepherd to his flock. It also can be translated, The LORD my Friend.
YHWH Rapha	The LORD who Heals	Occurs one time, in Exodus 15:26 (although many loose references to this name).	This name reminds us that God is our great physician who holds the power to heal the physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual needs of His people.
YHWH Shammah	The LORD is There	Occurs one time, in Ezekiel 48:35.	This name speaks to God's omnipresence. Shammah is a symbolic name for the earthly Jerusalem. God has not abandoned His people. He is always with us.
YHWH Tsidkenu	The LORD our Righteousness	Occurs two times, in Jeremiah 23:6 and 33:16.	This name reminds us that we are unrighteous and sinful on our own, but because of Jesus, we have a right standing with God in heaven.
YHWH Mekoddishkem	The LORD who Sanctifies	Occurs two times, in Exodus 31:13 and Leviticus 20:8	This name reminds us that God has set us apart, calls us to be holy, and is constantly sanctifying us from one degree of glory to another. There is a strong connection between our sanctification and Sabbath rest.
YHWH Qanna	The LORD is Jealous	Occurs 6 times. It's first used in Exodus 20:5.	Revealed in the third commandment, this name reminds us that God alone deserves our devotion, trust, praise, and worship. He is divinely and rightly jealous, a consuming fire.
YHWH Jireh	The LORD will Provide	Occurs one time, in Genesis 22:14.	It can also be translated, The LORD has seen. This name was given to Mount Moriah to Abraham to memorialize the intercession of God in the sacrifice of Isaac by providing a substitute.
YHWH Shalom	The LORD is Peace	Occurs one time, in Judges 6:24.	This name reminds us that God turns chaos and confusion into order and harmony. name given to the altar build by Gideon in Ophrah.
YHWH Sabaoth	The LORD of Hosts	Occurs over 285 times (most frequently used in Jeremiah and Isaiah). It's first used in 1 Samuel 1:3.	It can also be translated, The LORD of Powers or The LORD of armies. This name expresses God's universal sovereignty over every army, both spiritual and earthly. He is the King over heaven and earth.
