# Choices Part 10 – Choice Words

# **Deuteronomy 30:16-20 (HCSB)**

<sup>16</sup> For I am commanding you today to love the LORD your God, to walk in His ways, and to keep His commands, statutes, and ordinances, so that you may live and multiply, and the LORD your God may bless you in the land you are entering to possess. <sup>17</sup> But if your heart turns away and you do not listen and you are led astray to bow down to other gods and worship them, <sup>18</sup> I tell you today that you will certainly perish and will not live long in the land you are entering to possess across the Jordan. <sup>19</sup> I call heaven and earth as witnesses against you today that I have set before you life and death, blessing and curse. Choose life so that you and your descendants may live, <sup>20</sup> love the LORD your God, obey Him, and remain faithful to Him. For He is your life, and He will prolong your life in the land the LORD swore to give to your fathers Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob."

## Proverbs 15:1-4 (HCSB)

#### **Proverbs 18:20-21 (HCSB)**

<sup>20</sup> From the fruit of his mouth a man's stomach is satisfied; he is filled with the product of his lips. <sup>21</sup> Life and death are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit.

- The quality of the life you are living depends on what you have been saying.
  - o In other words, your success, or lack thereof, depends a lot upon your mouth.
    - I know people who have a belly full of bitterness, resentment, strife and broken relationships.
      - Whether or not they know it, they're "eating" the fruit of their mouths.
    - It may seem odd, but in a very real spiritual sense, your mouth is producing the things that are filling your life.

## Proverbs 12:14 (HCSB)

A man will be satisfied with good by the words of his mouth, and the work of a man's hands will reward him.

# Proverbs 13:3 (HCSB)

The one who guards his mouth protects his life; the one who opens his lips invites his own ruin.

- (MBC) A wise man speaks wise words; this produces (the sense of fruit) good things both for himself and for those who heed him (like the wise son in v.
  - 1). Conversely, because a treacherous person (like the mocker in v. 1) craves violence, his words aim to hurt others while ultimately coming back to harm himself. For these reasons, a wise man guards his words carefully whereas the fool has a big mouth (v. 3). It really is a matter of life and death because rash words—be they hasty "promises, assertions, disclosures"—produce ruin, whether "financial, social, physical, spiritual" (Kidner, Proverbs, 101).

#### **Proverbs 17:27-28 (HCSB)**

The intelligent person restrains his words, and one who keeps a cool head is a man of understanding. Even a fool is considered wise when he keeps silent, discerning when he seals his lips.

# **Psalm 141:3 (HCSB)**

LORD, set up a guard for my mouth; keep watch at the door of my lips.

#### **Psalm 39:1 (HCSB)**

I said, "I will guard my ways so that I may not sin with my tongue; I will guard my mouth with a muzzle as long as the wicked are in my presence."

# **Proverbs 26:18-19 (HCSB)**

<sup>18</sup> Like a madman who throws flaming darts and deadly arrows, <sup>19</sup> so is the man who deceives his neighbor and says, "I was only joking!"

# **Proverbs 6:16-19 (HCSB)**

<sup>16</sup> The LORD hates six things; in fact, seven are detestable to Him: <sup>17</sup> arrogant eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood, <sup>18</sup> a heart that plots wicked schemes, feet eager to run to evil, <sup>19</sup> a lying witness who gives false testimony, and one who stirs up trouble among brothers.

#### Matthew 12:37 (HCSB)

<sup>37</sup> For by your words you will be acquitted, and by your words you will be condemned."

# 1 Peter 3:10- (HCSB)

<sup>10</sup> For the one who wants to love life and to see good days must keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit, <sup>11</sup> and he must turn away from evil and do what is good. He must seek peace and pursue it.

- Words have the ability to build bridges,

But only say the word, and my servant will be cured. <sup>9</sup> For I too am a man under authority, having soldiers under my command. <sup>[a]</sup> I say to this one, 'Go!' and he goes; and to another, 'Come!' and he comes; and to my slave, 'Do this!' and he does it." <sup>10</sup> Hearing this, Jesus was amazed and said to those following Him, "I assure you: I have not found anyone in Israel with so great a faith! <sup>11</sup> I tell you that many will come from east and west, and recline at the table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven. <sup>12</sup> But the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." <sup>13</sup> Then Jesus told the centurion, "Go. As you have believed, let it be done for you." And his servant was cured that very moment. <sup>[b]</sup>
