# A Welcome for Those With Young Children

Until our Lord comes, Christians live in a kind of exile, and the number "70" is the number of exile in Scripture, recalling the 70 years of Israel's exile in Babylon . . .

. . . Our "little exile" of 70 days (Pre-Lent + Lent) dips into that experience, keeping us from false happiness and comfort in this world by teaching us to long and pray for more. In that longing for Christ, a true and even greater happiness than the world can provide comes to us, as we set our hope not on what can be seen, but on what cannot be seen (2 Corinthians 4:18).

"Let us worship before the Lord who made us," because we did not worship when he made us, and yet he made us all the same. So having made us before we worshiped him, is he going to desert us when we worship him? If someone were doubting whether he would be listened to when he prayed, Scripture reassures him when it says, "Let us cry *before the* Lord who made us."
