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Reflection Questions:

- · Jesus said, "Abide in me, and I in you." What does "abiding" practically look like in your daily life?
- · How does understanding the roles of the Vine (Jesus), the Vinedresser (the Father), and the Branches (us) deepen your understanding of your relationship with God?
- Pruning is painful but purposeful. Can you share a season in your life when God's pruning led to more fruit or spiritual growth?
- · Why do you think Jesus said, "Apart from me, you can do nothing"? How does this truth challenge the way you approach your work, ministry, or relationships?
- Jesus called Himself the true vine, implying there are false vines. What are some "false vines" people today might attach themselves to for identity or purpose?
- · How can we tell whether we are genuinely abiding in Christ versus just doing religious activity?
- When life feels like a pruning season, how can believers "not grow weary in doing good" (Galatians 6:9)? What spiritual habits or community practices help you endure those times?
- For someone who has stopped abiding in Christ, what would repentance and re-connection to the True Vine look like in real, practical steps?
