

The Door & **The Good Shepherd**

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Shepherd/Flock Imagery in the Bible:

- In the Old Testament...
 - God is often pictured as the shepherd and the people as His flock

Psalm 23:1, 77:20, 79:13, 80:1, 95:7

- God's Anointed One, the Messiah, is also pictured as the shepherd of the sheep Isaiah 40:11; Micah 5:4; Ezekiel 34:11-12, 22
- The leaders of the people are described as the shepherds of God's people and nation Jeremiah 23:1; Ezekiel 34:1
- The New Testament writers also used the same familiar terminology to describe the **Church** Acts 20:28-29; 1 Peter 5:2-3
