
## Christians on Campus Worship & Ministry Series March 3, 2024

## The Experience of the Holy Place: The Table of the Bread of the Presence



The way in the tabernacle is a picture of Christ as our unique way.

**John 14:6** I am the way and the reality and the life; no one comes to the Father except through Me.

After the experience of the altar of burnt offering (the cross) in the outer court (earth) comes the experience of the table of the bread (life) of the presence in the Holy Place (heaven)—Exo. 25:23-30.

**Gal. 2:20a** I am crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me.

**John 6:56-57** He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me and I in him. As the living Father has sent Me and I live because of the Father, so he who eats Me, he also shall live because of Me.

**Col. 3:1, 3-4** If therefore <u>you were raised</u> together with Christ, seek the things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God...For <u>you died</u>, and <u>your life is hidden</u> <u>with Christ in God</u>. When <u>Christ our life</u> is manifested, then you also will be manifested with Him in glory.

Christ as the bread of life is enjoyed in the church as the real tabernacle of God today (1 Tim. 3:15), especially at the Lord's table.

**1 Cor. 10:16** The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the fellowship of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the fellowship of the body of Christ?
