Philippians 3:12-16

12 Not that I have already obtained it or have already become perfect, but I press on so that I may lay hold of that for which also I was laid hold of by Christ Jesus.

13 Brethren, I do not regard myself as having laid hold of it yet; but one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and reaching forward to what lies ahead,

14 I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

15 Let us therefore, as many as are perfect, have this attitude; and if in anything you have a different attitude, God will reveal that also to you;

16 however, let us keep living by that same standard to which we have attained.

1. The Goal Motivates Us to Press On (verse 12)

"Growing in the knowledge of Christ implies a more fruitful consideration of His resurrection. The justice of God arrested Christ, and cast Him into the grave as into a prison. If Christ were not risen, our faith would be in vain, and the guilt and power of sin would remain. Christ being raised, He triumphed over death and Satan, and true believers are delivered from sin's punishment and power! For believers, there is a very great power and virtue to be derived from the resurrection of our Lord. There is power to raise a drooping spirit (John 20:17); power to make carnal affections to be spiritual, and set the affections on things above (Col. 3:1-2); power to confirm and establish the soul in grace (Rom. 6:9)." ~Nathaniel Vincent¹

2. Do This One Thing to Gain the Goal (verse 13)

3. The Goal is Everything (verse 14)

"All is loss that comes between us and Christ." ~George MacDonald³

4. How the Goal Streamlines Your Daily Choices (verses 15-16)

"The greatest and hardest work of a Christian is the well-ordering of his heart, which is unseen. A good Christian begins his repentance where his sin begins, in his thoughts. ... As we desire our whole man to be saved by Christ, so we must yield the whole man to be governed by Him. We must conform to the truth and goodness of God in the inner man, or we will wrong our own souls with false apprehensions and will view things in a way different than God intended. ... God counts it an honor when we regard His all-seeing eye so much that we do not take liberty in what is offensive to Him, no, not even in our hearts." ~ Richard Sibbes⁴

Communion with Christ is a certain cure for every ill. Whether it be the wormwood of woe, or the cloying surfeit of earthly delight, close fellowship with the Lord Jesus will take bitterness from the one, and satiety from the other. Live near to Jesus, Christian, and it is matter of secondary importance whether thou livest on the mountain of honor or in the valley of humiliation. Living near to Jesus, thou art covered with the wings of God, and underneath thee are the everlasting arms. Let nothing keep thee
