1 Corinthians 6:13-17

13 Food is for the stomach and the stomach is for food, but God will do away with both of them. Yet the body is not for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body. 14 Now God has not only raised the Lord, but will also raise us up through His power. 15 Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take away the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? May it never be! 16 Or do you not know that the one who joins himself to a prostitute is one body with her? For He says, "THE TWO SHALL BECOME ONE FLESH." 17 But the one who joins himself to the Lord is one spirit with Him.

1. Your Body is Not For Immorality.

- a. Why is the statement Food is for the stomach and stomach is for food used to compare it to immorality?
- b. Whose body does your body belong to as a believer?
- c. What are some examples of ways that we can dishonor the Lord with our bodies? What are some ways we can honor him?
- d. What are some practical ways to tell if something has mastery over your life?

2. Your Body Will Be Resurrected.

- a. From verse 14 what do we know about our physical bodies?
- b. How does the assurance of our future resurrection impact the way we approach challenges, temptations, and daily life in the present?

3. Your Body Is A Member of Christ

- a. How should the knowledge that once you are saved you are part of Christ's body effect the way you think about temptation or falling into immorality.
- b. Why is it so serious that we fall into immorality if we are apart of Christ's body Christians?
- c. How should the fact that all believers are members of Christ's body effect our view of our brothers and sisters in the church? Does our sin effect them?



4. Sexual Immorality Leads to Spiritual Unity.

- a. Is sexual immorality just a physical bond or a natural process of the body?
- b. Why is a spiritual bond made when we commit sexual immorality?
- c. If you are a believer why is it considered committing adultery on the Lord when you participate in acts of immorality (whether it be sexual or other forms of immorality)?

5. We Are One Spirit With Christ:

- a. How does a person become one spirit with Christ?
- b. What does it mean to be one Spirit with Christ?
- c. One of the only earthly comparisons we have to this is the marriage of a husband and wife and how the wife loves her husband as her head. Do you ever think of Christ as your bridegroom? How should this effect the way you view sin?
- d. Do your desires and motivations reflect that of Christ? What are some ways that your desires can match up with Christ's desires?
 - i. Example: Luke 2:49, Being about my Father's business.
 - ii. John 4, My food is to do the will of him who sent me.
