Unmasking Temptation

1 Corinthians 10:13

13 No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it.

Passage Summary:

Lest they think their predicament was unique, in 10:12–13 Paul reminds them that it was not, in both a negative and a positive way. All Christian believers face the challenge of tests and temptations to the integrity of their faith. These may vary from person to person and from occasion to occasion, but the pressure is ever present to understand what Christ would have us do. It could be whether to eat meat offered to idols (still very real in some contexts today) or whether to participate in certain kinds of social gatherings—and Christians may disagree about these matters. No believer is unique in the burden of the potential sin they bear.

However, on the positive side, every believer, the Corinthians as well as believers today, can find reassurance in the promise Paul issues here. Since God does not want his people to sin, he shields them from insurmountable pressure to succumb to its allure. He is aware of whether a person is a sapling or a weathered oak, a novice recruit or a seasoned veteran. God also will clarify the thinking of the humble inquirer about what to do and provide the means to do it.
