

# 5-Day Devotional: Living in the Identity of His Blood

## Day 1: The Life-Giving Blood

**Reading:** Leviticus 17:11; John 6:53-56

**Devotional:** God declared thousands of years ago that life is in the blood — a truth science would later confirm. Just as physical blood carries oxygen to every cell, sustaining life moment by moment, Jesus' blood carries spiritual life to every part of your being. When you accepted Christ, you received a complete blood transfusion. His life literally became yours. Today, pause and consider: are you living from this reality? The same power that defeated death flows through you. Your anxiety, shame, and fear were not part of this transfusion—only His life, His peace, His victory. Take a deep breath and remember: every breath you take whispers His name (Yahweh), and His blood sustains your spiritual life.

## Day 2: Adopted Into His Bloodline

**Reading:** Galatians 3:26-29; Ephesians 1:3-6

**Devotional:** Through Jesus' blood covenant, you have been legally adopted into God's family. Like an adoption that issues a new birth certificate, God has rewritten your identity. You didn't just join His family—you were born into it, as if you were never anything else. Every inheritance right, every blessing, every promise belongs to you completely. The enemy may whisper that you're disqualified by your past, but your birth certificate says otherwise. You carry God's name, His nature, His authority. Today, reject the lie that you're somehow less than His other children. You are fully His, marked by His blood, carrying His promises for a thousand generations. Walk in the confidence of your legal standing as a beloved child of the King.

## Day 3: The Covenant That Changes Everything

**Reading:** Hebrews 9:11-22; Genesis 15:7-21

**Devotional:** When God made covenant with Abraham, He alone walked through the sacrificed animals—taking full responsibility for keeping the promise. On the cross, Jesus did the same for you. He didn't ask you to meet Him halfway; He walked the entire path through blood and death to secure your salvation. This covenant isn't based on your performance but on His finished work. Every time you struggle with feeling unworthy, remember: the covenant was sealed by His faithfulness, not yours. His blood silences every accusation. It carries authority over every diagnosis, every addiction, every broken relationship. Today, declare this truth: "I am covenant-marked. His blood has spoken over my life, and what God has declared, no one can revoke."

## **Day 4: Seated in Heavenly Places**

**Reading:** Colossians 3:1-4; Ephesians 2:4-7

**Devotional:** You died with Christ, and now your life is hidden with Him in God. This isn't metaphorical—it's your actual position. You are seated in heavenly places, above every circumstance that tries to define you. The old you, with all its dysfunction and trauma, is dead and gone. Stop living from your earthly struggles and start living from your heavenly identity. When challenges arise, address them from your position of authority in Christ, not from a place of defeat. Your first thought is often your carnal thought—pause, wait for the second thought that aligns with truth. Do you have faith in Christ? Yes. But do you have faith in the Christ IN you? That's the question that changes everything. Live today from your throne, not from the dirt.

## **Day 5: Communion—Declaring Your New Identity**

**Reading:** 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; 1 John 5:1-12

**Devotional:** Communion is more than remembrance—it's declaration. When you take the bread and cup, you're not just recalling what Jesus did; you're accepting that His body is now your body, His blood is now your blood. You are receiving the truth that Christ lives in you and you in Him. The three witnesses—the Spirit, the water, and the blood—testify to your new identity. Your body is 70 percent water; when His blood flows through you, the temperature changes. His healing rushes in wherever you need it

—hot or cold, it brings transformation. Today, take time to declare: "I am not defined by my diagnosis, my past, my failure, or my fear. I am defined by His blood. I am a new creation, and I like it like that." Believe what God says about you, and watch everything shift.
