Digging Deeper

1. What do you make of God being jealous of His people in v. 18-19?

What Joel understood about God's name is crucial. His name represents His character. Read this out loud and memorize.

"Yet even now, declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and **rend** your hearts and not your garments. Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster." (Joel 2:12–13, ESV)

- 2. God sends us blessing to worship Him. It had been taken away (Joel 1:9). Now he will restore the relationship (2:19). How do you restore your own relationship with God?
- 3. Who is the "northerner" in v. 20?
- 4. In v. 25 God says "I will repay you for the years …." of the locust plague damage. What did this mean for God's people then? What does it mean for you?
- 5. How would you describe the Holy Spirit's activity in your life? (v. 3:28-29)
- 6. How can we apply v. 32 ... "then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved ...?"
