Genesis 3:6-24 "The Fall of man into Sin Pt. 2" Verses

Introduction

Gen 3:1

Now the serpent was more cunning than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said to the woman, "Has God indeed said, 'You shall not eat of every tree of the garden'?"

Gen 3:2-3

- 2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat the fruit of the trees of the garden;
- 3 but of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God has said, 'You shall not eat it, **nor shall you touch it, lest you die.'**"

Gen 3:4-5

- 4 Then the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die.
- 5 For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, **and you will be like God**, knowing good and evil."

3:6 Adam and Eve both disobey God in their own way.

Gen 3:6

6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree desirable to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate. She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate.

1 John 2:16

16 For all that is in the world -- the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life - is not of the Father but is of the world.

... She also gave to her husband with her, and he ate.

Therefore, it is Adam, not Eve, who bears the responsibility for the fall of the human race and for the introduction of death into the created order.

Eve was tricked into sinning; Adam knew exactly what he was doing.

1 Tim 2:14

14 And Adam was not deceived, but the woman being deceived, fell into transgression.

1. Adam's sin extended to the entire human race. Because of Adam, sin entered the world.

Rom 5:12

12 Therefore, <u>just as through one man sin entered the world</u>, and <u>death through sin</u>, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned—

2. death came to all mankind, in same way Christ effects ALL of mankind with LIFE!!

Rom 5:15

15 But the free gift is not like the offense. For if by the one man's offense many died, much more the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abounded to many.

1 Cor 15:22

22 For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

3. death reigned over man and creation.....the opposite is true in Christ

Rom 5:17

17 For <u>if by the one man's offense death reigned through the one</u>, <u>much more those</u> <u>who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life</u> through the One, Jesus Christ.)

4. all men were condemned.....the opposite is true in Christ

Rom 5:18

18 Therefore, <u>as through one man's offense judgment came to all men</u>, <u>resulting in condemnation</u>, even so <u>through one Man's righteous act the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life</u>.

5. and all men were made sinners.....the opposite is true in Christ

Rom 5:19

19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so also by one Man's obedience many will be made righteous.

3:7 The nakedness of Adam and Eve.

Gen 3:7

7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves coverings.

3:8-9 Adam and Eve hide from God; God calls out to them.

Gen 3:8-9

8 And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

9 Then the LORD God called to Adam and said to him, "Where are you?"

3:10-12 Adam tries to explain his sin.

Gen 3:10-12

- 10 So he said, "I heard Your voice in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; and I hid myself."
- 11 And He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you that you should not eat?"
- 12 Then the man said, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate."

Psalms 32:3-5

3 When I kept silent, my bones grew old

Through my groaning all the day long.

4 For day and night Your hand was heavy upon me;

My vitality was turned into the drought of summer. Selah

5 I acknowledged my sin to You,

And my iniquity I have not hidden.

I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,"

And You forgave the iniquity of my sin. Selah

Prov 28:13

13 He who covers his sins will not prosper,

But whoever confesses and forsakes them will have mercy.

1 John 1:9

9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

3:13 Eve's reply to God.

Gen 3:13

13 And the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?"

The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."

3:14-15 God's curse upon the serpent.

Gen 3:14-15

14 So the LORD God said to the serpent:

"Because you have done this,

You are cursed more than all cattle.

And more than every beast of the field;

On your belly you shall go,

And you shall eat dust

All the days of your life.

15 And I will put enmity

Between you and the woman,

And between your seed and her Seed;

He shall bruise your head,

And you shall bruise His heel."

Hebrews 2:14

14 Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, <u>He Himself likewise</u> shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil,

Colossians 2:15

15 Having disarmed principalities and powers, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it.

Rom 16:20

20 And the God of peace will crush Satan under your feet shortly.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. Amen.

3:16 God's curse upon the woman....to bless her

Gen 3:16

16 To the woman He said: "I will greatly multiply your sorrow and your conception; In pain you shall bring forth children; Your desire [shall be] for your husband, And he shall rule over you."

3:17-19 God's curse upon the man....to bless him

Gen 3:17-19

17 Then to Adam He said, "Because you have heeded the voice of your wife, and have eaten from the tree of which I commanded you, saying, 'You shall not eat of it':

"Cursed is the ground for your sake;

In toil you shall eat of it

All the days of your life.

18 Both thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you,

And you shall eat the herb of the field.

19 In the sweat of your face you shall eat bread

Till you return to the ground.

For out of it you were taken;

For dust you are,

And to dust you shall return."

3:20 The naming of Eve.

Gen 3:20

20 And Adam called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all living.

3:21 God clothes Adam and Eve in the skins of animals.

Gen 3:21

21 Also for Adam and his wife the LORD God made tunics of skin, and clothed them.

Hebrews 9:22

22 And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission.

3:22-24 God sets cherubim to guard the Tree of Life.

Gen 3:22-24

22 Then the LORD God said, "Behold, the man has become like one of Us, to know good and evil. And now, lest he put out his hand and take also of the tree of life, and eat, and live forever"

23 therefore the LORD God sent him out of the garden of Eden to till the ground from which he was taken.

24 So He drove out the man; and He placed cherubim at the east of the garden of Eden, and a flaming sword which turned every way, to guard the way to the tree of life.
