

1. In the sermon, precision and planning are highlighted as crucial for success in difficult situations, much like the A-Team's approach. How does Proverbs 16:3 ("Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and he will establish your plans.") guide us in balancing human planning with spiritual trust?

2. The sermon shares a story of transformation performed by Peter and John in the Bible. Discuss a time when you witnessed or experienced a 'miracle' that defied explanation. How does Acts 3:16 ("By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has completely healed him, as you can all see.") resonate with this experience?

3. Reflecting on the steps to redemption, the sermon speaks about recognizing and rectifying past ignorance, particularly in a spiritual sense. Can you think of biblical examples, such as Peter's denial and subsequent repentance (Luke 22:54-62), that demonstrate the importance of acknowledging and learning from our mistakes?

4. The concept of having our sins 'blotted out' is likened to deleting personal data from the internet in the sermon. How does this analogy help us understand God's forgiveness, and what comfort do we find in scriptures like Psalm 51:1-2 ("Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.")?

5. The sermon mentions the importance of aligning our lives with divine guidance. Discuss the challenges of discerning God's plan for us and share insights from Jeremiah 29:11 ("For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.").

6. The theme of rescue and redemption is central to the sermon, with a call to confess, repent, and place faith in Jesus. In light of this message, how can we apply 1 John 1:9 ("If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.") to our daily lives?

7. The sermon concludes with a prayer for strength, wisdom, and courage to follow God's plan. How can we support each other in our spiritual journeys to live out Ephesians 6:10-18, which encourages us to put on the full armor of God?

8. The story shared about the special response team's intervention highlights the unpredictable nature of life. How does the peace that comes from trusting in God, as described in Philippians 4:7 ("And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."), help us navigate through the crises we face?
