- 1. There's an invisible world that <u>impacts</u> our visible world every single day.
- 2. The Bible says there is a distorter of truth. He distorts the truth just enough to get us in trouble, but not enough to <u>scare</u> us away.

- 3. Jesus believed that the devil's ultimate agenda was the destruction of human life, and that the means by which he destroyed human life was through the truth.

John 16:33 - "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."
