### Spiritual phrases we say:

- Everything happens for a reason.
- God helps those who help themselves.
- God is my co-pilot.

We need to examine these sayings in light of Scripture. Here's why this is important:

- These statements lead people to conclusions about God, and some of those conclusions are just not <u>true</u>.
- 2. We may be unintentionally hurting people or pushing them away from God when we use these sayings.

## Why Do We Say It?

I think we say it as sort of a **spiritual pep-talk**.

• "You got this!" "Hang in there!" "Don't give up!" "God won't give you more than you can handle."

# Why Does It Sound Biblical?

1 Corinthians 10 - No temptation has seized you except what is common to man. And God is faithful; he will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it.

#### The Truth

Sometimes you will face more than you can handle.

John 16:33 - "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

### YOU...ARE...NOT...ALONE!

- It means that when hard times come, it's all right to admit: "I can't handle this by myself. I need help."
- It means it's all right to lean on God and other Christ-followers to get you through whatever you're going through.
- And it means we don't have to be superheroes because we have a Hero who reigns supreme.

Bumper sticker saying is not true, but the truth we have is even better:	
<b>Big Idea</b> : "God will help you handle you've been given."	
When we face something we can't handle on our own we need to:	
1. Depend on	
Psalm 46:1 - God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.	
1 Peter 5:7- Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.	
2. Depend on God others.	
Galatians 6:2-5 - Carry each other's <u>burdens</u> , and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ. <sup>3</sup> If anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing, he deceives himself. <sup>4</sup> Each one should test his own actions. Then he can take pride in himself, without comparing himself to somebody else, <sup>5</sup> for each one should carry <u>his own load</u> .
